In this class, you will make samples of different quilting ideas that can be executed on the home sewing machine with a walking foot. You will create samples of walking foot designs on small quilt sandwiches to help you understand what makes each design successful. We will also look at variations of the designs you stitch out. 

March 2024 Quilt Block

Welcome to our fifth block in our series to continue support of our Sharing Gifts Program. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1 (the link to the Sharing Gifts Policy is at the bottom of Supporting Sharing Gifts page).

Our block pattern for March 2024 is the Double Churn Dash.



Once again, we will be using the Missouri Star Quilt Company's technique to make the block. Watch the video on YouTube at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8DuchY37ooc. Block construction starts around 1:30 minute into the video and goes to 15:10 minutes.

This is going to make a GIANT quilt block!

Color Way: Your choice of colors/prints.

What you need:

Background Colour

- Two, 2 ¹⁄₂" x WOF* strips
- One, 10" Square

Colour #1

- One, 2 ¹/₂" x WOF* strip

Colour #2

One, 2 ½" x WOF* strip


- Contrasting Colour
 - One, 10" square
 - One, 4 ¹/₂" square

*WOF = Width of fabric

Use a scant ¼" seam. Your stitch line should fall just inside the ¼" line on your ruler when measuring the seam allowance.


Step 1. – Make 8 half square triangles

- Layer the 10" squares of background colour and contrasting colour right sides together.
- On the lighter colour, draw a diagonal line both ways across the square.
- Sew ¹/₄" on both sides of each line.



Step 1 (continued).

- Cut the block into eight sections.



- Open and press each half square triangle unit (press to the darker fabric).

Cut horizontal and vertical

- Square up each unit to $4 \frac{1}{2}$ x $4 \frac{1}{2}$.



Step 2. – Preparing strip sets.

- Sew one background colour 2 ¹/₂" strip to the colour #1, 2 ¹/₂" strip.
- Sew one background colour 2 1/2" strip to the colour #2, 2 1/2" strip.



- Open each strip set and press to the darker fabric.				
Step 3. – Sub cut the strip sets				
- From each strip set you will need to cut, two 4 ½" strips and two 12 ½" strips.				

Step 4. – Making the inner Chun Dash block

You will need:


- Four half square triangles blocks
- The 4 ¹/₂" square contrasting colour
- Two 4 ¹/₂" strip set of colour #1/background.
- Two 4 ¹/₂" strip set of colour #2/background.

Lay out the components for the inner Churn Dash block.



- Sew the blocks together:
 - First sew the top row, then the middle row and lastly the bottom row sections.
 - \circ Then sew the three rows together. Refer to the video.
 - Press the top and bottom rows seams outwards.
 - Press the center row seams inwards.

You have now completed the inner Churn Dash Block. This should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".




Step 5. – Completing the Double Churn Dash Block

You will need:

- The inner Churn Dash block completed in step 4.
- Four half square triangle blocks.
- Two 12 ¹/₂" strip set of colour #2/background.
- Two 12 ¹/₂" strip set of colour #2/background.

Lay out the components for the Double Churn Dash ensuring your colour #1 and #2 strips are on opposite sides of the inner churn dash block.




Step 5 (continued).

- Sew the block together.
 - First sew the top row, then the middle row and lastly the bottom row sections.
 - Then sew the three rows together.
 - Refer to the video on pressing the seams.

Congratulations!

You have now completed the giant Double Churn Dash Block. Your block should measure 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 20 $\frac{1}{2}$.



What a quick way to make a giant quilt block!

Bring your completed block(s) to the March meeting. If you're unable to attend the meeting you can have a friend, bring them on your behalf. You can also drop them off in the guild's basket at the Quilted Raven (top of the library shelf) no later than March 13th for the March meeting and I will pick it up and bring it to the meeting. If dropping off blocks, please put your name on them so I can announce who made them.

Mushroom-Beef Stew

I am cooking this recipe as I am putting this newsletter together.

Provide by Leslie Thomas Source: Crock Pot[®] and © 2007 Sunbeam Products

Ingredients:

Directions:

1 pound beef stew meat 1 can (10 $\frac{3}{4}$ ounces) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted 2 cans (4 ounces each) sliced mushrooms, drained 1 package (1 ounce) dry onion soup mix Hot cooked noodles Combine all ingredients except noodles in 2- to 3-quart slow cooker. Cover, cook on Low 8 to 10 hours. Serve over noodles.

Makes 4 servings.

Note: I added bite sized carrots, onion, and potatoes and cooked for 6 hours. Omitted the package of dry onion soup mix and added garlic powder and a Moroccan spice from Epicure. Served with brown rice.


