## March 2024 Quilt Block

Welcome to our fifth block in our series to continue support of our Sharing Gifts Program. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1 (see bottom of the web page for the Sharing Gifts link).

Our block pattern for March 2024 is the Double Churn Dash.


Once again, we will be using the Missouri Star Quilt Company's technique to make the block. Watch the video on YouTube at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8DuchY37ooc . Block construction starts around 1:30 minute into the video and goes to $15: 10$ minutes.

This is going to make a GIANT quilt block!
Color Way: your choice of colours/prints.

## What you need:

Background Colour

- Two, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF* strips
- One, 10" square

Colour \#1

- One, $21 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF $^{*}$ strip

Colour \#2

- One, $21 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF $^{*}$ strip

Contrasting Colour

- One, 10" square
- One, $41 / 2 "$ square
*WOF = Width of Fabric
Use a scant $1 / 4$ " seam. Your stitch line should fall just inside the $1 / 4$ " line on your ruler when measuring the seam allowance.


## Step 1.

Make 8 half-square triangles.

- Layer the 10" squares of background color and contrasting color right sides together.
- On the lighter color, draw a diagonal line both ways across the square.
- Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on both sides of each line.

- Cut the block into eight sections.

> Cut horizontal and vertical first, then the diagonals


- Open and press each half-square triangle unit (press to the darker fabric).
- Square up each unit to $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


Step 2.
Preparing strip sets.

- Sew one background colour $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the colour \#1, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip.
- Sew one background colour $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the colour \#2, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip.

Layer


Sew


- Open each strip set and press to the darker fabric.

## Step 3.

Sub-cut the strip sets.

- From each strip set you will need to cut, two $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips and two $121 / 2 "$ strips.


Step 4.
Making the inner Chun Dash block.
You will need:

- Four half square triangle blocks
- The $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square contracting color
- Two $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip set of color \#1/Background.
- Two $41 / 2 "$ strip set of color \#2/background.

Lay out the components for the inner Churn Dash block.


- Sew the block together.
- First sew the top row, then the middle row and lastly the bottom row sections.
- Then sew the three rows together. Refer to the video.
- Press the top and bottom rows seams outwards.
- Press the centre row seams inwards.

You have now completed the inner Churn Dash Block.
This should measure $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## Step 5.

Completing the Double Churn Dash Block.
You will need:

- The inner Churn Dash Block completed in step 4.
- Four half square triangle blocks
- Two $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip set of colour \#1/Background.
- Two $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip set of colour \#2/Background.

Lay out the components for the Double Churn Dash ensuring your color \#1 and \#2 strips are on opposite sides of the inner churn dash block.


- Sew the block together.
- First sew the top row, then the middle row and lastly the bottom row sections.
- Then sew the three rows together.
- Refer to the video on pressing the seams.

Congratulations! You have now completed the giant Double Churn Dash Block. Your block should measure $201 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 201 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


What a quick way to make a giant quilt block.
Bring your completed block(s) to the March meeting. If you are unable to attend the meeting you can have a friend, bring them on your behalf.
