

THREAD BETWEEN THE LINES

This year we are thrilled to introduce a new quilt challenge that's going to stretch our imaginations, tickle our funny bones and maybe teach us something new about language. This year's Challenge is called "Thread Between the Lines" and the theme is Idioms!



Those quirky little phrases we use every day – like "raining cats and dogs," "a stitch in time saves nine," or "don't cry over spilled milk."


Idioms are more than just expressions, they're tiny stories, cultural snapshots, and poetic puzzles and now we're going to turn them into quilts!



- Choose an idiom any idiom that speaks to you. It can be humorous, heartfelt, or downright peculiar.
- Interpret it visually through fabric, colour and design. You can be literal, abstract, or somewhere in between.
- Your quilt must be no smaller than a Fat Quarter in circumference but it can be "larger than life" and should clearly reflect the idiom you've chosen.
- Quilts must be made specifically for this challenge (existing quilts may not be repurposed for the challenge).
- Submissions must be *quilted and finished no UFO's!

We'll showcase the finished pieces at our year end meeting in June – you will be asked to present your quilt and say a few words on your chosen idiom and a short explanation of your interpretation. There will be prizes and members in attendance will vote for their favourite!

*Quilted means made of two layers of fabric filled with batting held in place with stitching.

I first saw this kitchen island used as a cutting table a few years ago when several quilters opened their sewing "studios" for tours. (Thanks, Dawn). You may find similar options elsewhere. I bought this one on sale, reorganized my sewing space to make it fit, and I love it.

Details on this item:

- For Living Wood top open shelf kitchen island with folding leaf
- 31" x 47" surface when opened; 36" high
- Weighs 300 lbs; assembly required (I recommend getting help with lifting and assembling)
- Currently available at Canadian Tire for \$472.49, but wait until it goes on sale.

























Seat Cushion Option

The one I have is the AutoTrends 2-in-1 Memory Foam Lumbar back seat cushion from Canadian Tire (I have included a photo). There are lots of different seat cushion options in the automotive section which was a surprise to most of the folks at the retreat so thought I would share the tip to check out the automotive section if you're looking for a good seat cushion to keep you comfy during your long sewing/quilting sessions!

Sweet Meatballs

You will need:

Meatballs

- 1.25 pounds ground beef
- ½ cup of bread crumbs
- ½ cup of water
- 1 tsp salt
- ¼ tsp pepper

Sauce

- 1 ¼ cup brown sugar
- 2 tsp flour (or 1 tsp corn starch)
- ½ cup white vinegar
- ½ cup water
- 2 tsp soya sauce
- 1 tbsp ketchup

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees
- 2. Mix meatballs and cook in oven for 20 minutes
- 3. Mix up sauce in pot and simmer on low for 15-20 minutes (until thick)
- 4. Add cooked meatballs to sauce in pot and simmer on low for approximately 10 minutes. Makes approximately 30-40 meatballs






Block of the Month Update

Longarm of the North

As a quilter you have been super productive and have another quilt top finished. It's too big to quilt on your domestic machine and you don't have time to send it out to have it quilted. Now what can you do?

Longarm of the North is a small shop on the lower level of the 50/50 Mini Mall which has a longarm quilting machine. You can work with me to decide on a pantograph and thread to finish your quilt. I will

be there to load your top, backing and batting. Then we will work on you becoming comfortable with the longarm itself. I will stay with you while you are using the machine.

If you prefer, I can quilt the top for you after you have decided on the pantograph and thread.

We also carry batting in a cotton blend, bamboo/cotton blend and wool.

Call Leslie at 867-444-9937 to make an appointment or drop in Tuesdays or Thursdays between 11 am and 5 pm to check us out. I am also willing to work the occasional Saturday.


