

Finished is Better than Perfect

My quilting goal this summer was to:

- 1) pull out tops that needed quilting and get them done
- 2) finish Valley Blossoms.

I made some progress on #1 and now have a stack of binding to do. That left me with Valley Blossoms, a Quiltworx pattern I started at a retreat at Quiltworx in Montana, in March 2022. I finished piecing the pieces, including the inside appliqué in February of '23. Over the next couple of

cruises, I finished turning the appliqué pieces for the outside edges. By Spring '25 I was ready to start stitching. Now, if you have ever placed an appliqué piece, you know that the use of a light box is critical. However, that only works if your fabric is a light colour, not midnight blue. So, I carefully cut out a template and started placing and gluing the pieces.... until I discovered I was missing pieces!

My response to that little bombshell was to wrap the pieces around a foam roller and cover them with a clear plastic bag and hope that I could locate the bag. No such luck, so this month I prayed to the quilting gods, took a few deep breaths and unwrapped the 8 pieces that made up the 4 corners. Using the templates I had cut out, I started placing and stitching down the pieces using silk thread, a 70/10 sharp needle and a teeny tiny blanket stitch, creating the missing pieces as I went. Note to self - do not toss anything out till a project is completed and be grateful when you have leftover fabrics. It is now complete and ready for the custom complementary work of a long armer. Is it perfect - No! Is it finished - Yes! Am I happy with the results - Yes! Will it look lovely on a bed in its' forever home - Yes! And there you have it.... the Yes's have it.

3 Questions to Ask BEFORE STARTING YOUR NEXT QUILT

- Do I love this pattern or am I chasing a trend?
- Does this quilt fit the season of life I'm in right now?
- Am I okay with it turning out imperfectly?

3 Questions to Ask Before Starting Your Next Quilt

Before I jump into a brand-new quilt, I've learned to slow down just a bit and ask myself three simple but *super* powerful questions.

They've saved me from more than one burnout project and helped me fall in love with what I'm sewing while I'm sewing it.

Here they are, just for you:

- Do I love this pattern or am I chasing a trend?
- Does this quilt fit the season of life I'm in right now?
- Am I okay with it turning out imperfectly?

Let's unpack those together

Do I love this pattern or am I chasing a trend?

There's no shame in loving what's popular, but make sure your heart is in it too. Just because it's the quilt everyone is making on Instagram doesn't mean it's the quilt you need right now.

Clarity Step: Ask yourself: Will I *still* love this quilt in 6 weeks when I'm halfway through it and my thread keeps breaking?

Choose patterns that make your soul sparkle not just ones that are popular.

Does this quilt fit the season of life I'm in right now?

Are you in a slow, quiet season where detailed piecing sounds dreamy? Or a busy kids-fun-but-chaos season where a chunky block and chain-piecing is more your speed?

Clarity Step: Think about how much time and patience you have for a quilt right now and choose one that fits.

There's no "right" quilt but there is a right one for your right now. Pick something that feels fun, not overwhelming. Quilting should fill your cup, not drain it

Am I okay with it turning out imperfectly?

Because let's be real... it probably will. Mine do!

There will be wonky seams. Maybe a border that waves at you. Maybe a thread nest or two.

But also? There will be joy. Growth. A quilt that tells a story.

Some moments in life make mistakes while quilting hard to accept. That's ok. And you're going to have some patterns that need more precision. The trick is knowing what's true in your quilty life for right now.

Clarity Step: Can you say "yes" to sewing with joy instead of stress? That's the sign it's the quilt for you right now.

Release the pressure. Add the glitter. Sew anyway

So next time you're tempted to start "just one more quilt" ... run it through the checklist. Not to gatekeep your creativity, but to protect it. To honor your time.

And to make sure the next quilt you start brings you joy from the first cut to the final stitch.

You've got this, friend

Now go make something magical.




























Recipe

Rhubarb Crisp

This dessert recipe is from Kathryn Paddock (we had it at a retreat). Submitted by Linda Whitford

You will need:

Rhubard mix

4 c. Rhubarb

1 c. sugar

¼ c. flour

½ tsp. cinnamon

Topping

1 c. flour

½ c. rolled oats

1 c. brown sugar

½ c. butter

Directions:

- In a large mixing bowl, mix rhubarb mix ingredients together.
- 2. Place in 8 x 8 pan and pour ½ cup water over top.
- In a mixing bowl, mix topping ingredients together
- 4. Sprinkle over Rhubarb mix.
- 5. Bake at 375º for 35 mins.

Block of the Month Update


