May 2025 Quilt Block

The Quilt Guild continues the Block of the Month series in our Sharing Gifts Program. This is our ninth and final block in support of our Sharing Gifts Program for the 2024/2025 season. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1 (the link to the Sharing Gifts Policy is at the bottom of the Supporting Sharing Gifts page).

Our block pattern for May 2025 is called a **London Roads block**. This block is from the Ladies' Art Company Block Tool.

Color Way: Choose 3 to 5 prints/solids, keeping the same placement of light and dark/bright fabrics as the diagram.

What you need for one block:


A – two 4 ¼" squares

B - two 4 1/4" squares

C - six 11/2" x 3 1/2" rectangle

D - six 11/2" x 3 1/2" rectangle

E - one 31/2" square



Block size should be approximately 9 ½" x 9 ½" (unfinished).

Step 1

Cut fabrics into required pieces as stated above, then sub cut A, B fabrics into 8 triangles each.

Step 2

Sew A and B triangles together to make four units (3 ½" square). Pressing to the darker fabric.



Step 3

Sew two C to either side of D rectangle together to make two units. Pressing to the darker fabric.



Step 4


Sew two D to either long side of C rectangle together to make two units. Pressing to the darker fabric.



May block continued

Step 5

Layout the sewn units and cut piece according to the picture



Step 6

Starting on the top left, start sewing the units together row by row. C/D/C unit is sewn to a A/B unit, then another A/B unit is sewn to the right-hand side of the C/D/C unit. Press to the center unit.

Repeat this to create row 3.

Sew E piece to a D/C/D unit, then sew another D/C/D unit to the right-hand side of the E piece to form row 2. Press seams to the outside D/C/D units.

Step 7

Sew the three rows together matching the two in each row seams.

Press.

Bring your completed block(s) to the May meeting or the next meeting you attend. If you're unable to attend the May meeting, you can have a friend bring them on your behalf. You can also drop them off in the guild's basket at the Quilted Raven (top of the library shelf) no later than 3 pm on May 8th, and I will pick them up and bring them to the meeting. If dropping off blocks, please put your name on them so I can announce who made them.

QUILT CHALLENGE 2024/25 LUCK OF THE DRAWZ

The 2024 November Guild meeting revealed the 2024/25 Quilt Challenge, and 18 members signed on to do the challenge! Quilters will have until the June 2025 meeting to complete their submissions, which will consist of making two draws. You can still participate and complete your 'draws' at upcoming Guild meetings or contact Debbie to make arrangements outside of the meetings.

Each participant made two draws. The first draw was for the "Category," and the second was for the "Randomizer" item to incorporate into your submission.

There are 4 Categories:

Traditional Modern Scrappy Non-Quilt but Quilted Item

(cannot be a 'blanket' - could be an art quilt, table

runner, tea cozy, coat etc.)

The second draw was for the Randomizer item you must incorporate into your project. Randomizer items could be anything Quilty - a quilt block, a technique, a type of fabric, utilizing a quilting item, etc. There are 50 Randomizer items.

Judges will determine how well you incorporated the two together.

The Rules are:

- 1. You must incorporate your Category and Randomizer into your submission and reveal your challenge guilt at the June 2025 Guild Meeting.
- 2. Quilts must be made specifically for this challenge (existing quilts may not be repurposed for the challenge).
- 3. Submissions must be *quilted and finished no UFO's!
- 4. Quilts must be no smaller than 32" in circumference. There is no maximum size.
- 5. Members at the June meeting will judge how well you did!

For those of you who don't know, this is Sunbonnet Sue and she has not YET been drawn! Wouldn't she be fun??!





Good luck with your challenges everyone!

*Quilted means made of two layers of fabric filled with batting held in place with stitching.

Hi Kathryn,












April Guild Meeting Show 'n Tell




Dear Members,

You will need:

2 cups cooked long-grain or jasmine rice, preferably a day old or cold

1 pound cooked lean ground beef (about 2 cups cooked)

- 1 (15-ounce) can diced tomatoes 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 4 cloves gariic, minced
- 1 cup finely diced onion, divided 1 cop fresh herbs (a mix of dill,
- cilantro, and Italian parsley 1/3 cup each)
- 1 ½ teaspoon sea salt
 ½ teaspoon black pepper
 2 tablespoons olive oil
 6 to 8 large colored bell peppers
 (smaller peppers may be
 substituted, but more will be
 needed)
- 1 cup water
- 4 ounces canned tomato sauce

Mediterranean Stuffed Peppers

Slow Cooker

Directions:

- 1. In a large mixing bowl, combine rice, cooked ground beef, diced tomatoes, garlic, ½ cup diced onion, fresh herbs, salt, black pepper, and olive oil. Mix well.
- 2. Prepare bell peppers by removing the tops and hollowing out the insides. Stuff peppers with the filling mixture until full.
- 3. In the bottom of your slow cooker pour in water and tomato sauce. Add remaining diced onion and mix to combine. Arrange stuffed peppers over the sauce mixture. Cover and cook on HIGH for 2 to 3 hours, or until peppers are tender.
- Serve by spooning sauce from the bottom of the slow cooker over the stuffed peppers. Enjoy!
