February 2025 Quilt Block

The Quilt Guild continues the Block of the Month series in our Sharing Gifts Program. This is our sixth block in support of our Sharing Gifts Program for the 2024/2025 season. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1 (the link to the Sharing Gifts Policy is at the bottom of the Supporting Sharing Gifts page).

Our block pattern for February 2025 is called a **Double X, No. 1 block**.

Color Way: Choose four or five bright prints/solids from your fabric stash/scraps. One colour needs to be pink OR a variation of pink.

What you need for one block:

Colour A – two 4.5" squares

Colour B – two 4 7/8" squares


Colour C – three 4 7/8" squares

Colour D – one 4 7/8" square

Colour E – one 4½" square

Note: Colour A & C can be from the same fabric

Block size should be 12.5" x 12.5".



Step 1

Cut Colour B in half on the diagonal. You will have 4 triangles.

Step 2

Cut Colour C in half on the diagonal. You will have 6 triangles.

Step 3

Cut Colour D square in half on the diagonal. You will have 2 triangles.

Step 4

Layout the triangles and squares according to the picture above.

Step 5

Sew your triangles and squares by block then by rows.

Bring your completed block(s) to the February meeting or the next meeting you attend. If you're unable to attend the February meeting, you can have a friend bring them on your behalf. You can also drop them off in the guild's basket at the Quilted Raven (top of the library shelf) no later than 3 pm on February 13th and I will pick it up and bring it to the meeting. If dropping off blocks, please put your name on them so I can announce who made them.

QUILT CHALLENGE 2024/25 LUCK OF THE DRAWZ

The 2024 November Guild meeting revealed the 2024/25 Quilt Challenge, and 18 members signed on to do the challenge! Quilters will have until the June 2025 meeting to complete their submissions, which will consist of making two draws. You can still participate and complete your 'draws' at upcoming Guild meetings or contact Debbie to make arrangements outside of the meetings.

Each participant made two draws. The first draw was for the "Category," and the second was for the "Randomizer" item to incorporate into your submission.

There are 4 Categories:

Traditional Modern Scrappy Non-Quilt but Quilted Item

(cannot be a 'blanket' - could be an art quilt, table

runner, tea cozy, coat etc.)

The second draw was for the Randomizer item you must incorporate into your project. Randomizer items could be anything Quilty - a quilt block, a technique, a type of fabric, utilizing a quilting item, etc. There are 50 Randomizer items.

Judges will determine how well you incorporated the two together.

The Rules are:

- 1. You must incorporate your Category and Randomizer into your submission and reveal your challenge guilt at the June 2025 Guild Meeting.
- 2. Quilts must be made specifically for this challenge (existing quilts may not be repurposed for the challenge).
- 3. Submissions must be *quilted and finished no UFO's!
- 4. Quilts must be no smaller than 32" in circumference. There is no maximum size.
- 5. Members at the June meeting will judge how well you did!

For those of you who don't know, this is Sunbonnet Sue and she has not YET been drawn! Wouldn't she be fun??!

*Quilted means made of two layers of fabric filled with batting held in place with stitching.



Slow Cooker Garlic Butter Beef Bites & Potatoes

Source: Slow Cooker Garlic Butter Beef Bites

You will need:

- 2 lb beef stew meat
- 5 tablespoons butter, sliced
- 1 lb baby yellow potatoes, halved or quartered
- 1 tablespoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon chopped garlic
- 2 teaspoons seasoned salt
- ½ teaspoon black pepper
- ½ teaspoon smoked paprika (optional)
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning (optional)
- ½ cup beef broth
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

Optional add-ins:

- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 1 teaspoon fresh thyme or rosemary

Directions:

- 1. Prepare the ingredients
 - Wash and halve the baby potatoes.
 - Cut the stew meat into bite-sized chunks if not already precut.
- 2. Season the Beef & Potatoes
 - In a large bowl, toss the beef bites and potatoes with:
 - > Onion powder
 - Garlic powder
 - Seasoned salt & black pepper
 - Paprika & Italian seasoning (if using)
 - Stir well to coat everything evenly.
- 3. Load the Slow Cooker
 - Place half of the butter slices at the bottom of the slow cooker
 - Add seasoned beef bites & potatoes
 - Sprinkle the chopped garlic on the top
 - Pour in the beef broth & Worcestershire sauce.
 - Top everything with the remaining butter slices.
- 4. Slow Cook to Perfection.
 - Cook on LOW for 6 8 hours (for ultra-tender beef).
 - Or cook on HIGH for 3 4 hours (if short on time).
 - Stir once or twice during cooking if possible.
- 5. Serve & Enjoy!
 - Garnish with fresh chopped parsley or thyme.
 - Serve with extra garlic butter drizzled on top for even more richness!
