March 2025 Quilt Block

The Quilt Guild continues the Block of the Month series in our Sharing Gifts Program. This is our seventh block in support of our Sharing Gifts Program for the 2024/2025 season. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1 (the link to the Sharing Gifts Policy is at the bottom of the Supporting Sharing Gifts page).

Our block pattern for March 2025 is called a **To Use Up the Pieces block**. I sourced this block and February's block from the Ladies' Art Company Block Tool. I think this block will go well with the Double X, No. 1 block.

Color Way: Choose two prints/solids from your fabric stash/scraps. One colour needs to be green, a variation of green or a variation of green in the fabric.

What you need for one block:

A - one 9" square

B - three 5" squares

C – three 5" squares

D - one 9" square

Note: Original measurements were 8 7/8 and 4 7/8, respectively.

To make cutting more manageable, I have made the measurement whole numbers. Hopefully, the block can be trimmed to fit February's BOM.

Block size should be approximately 12 3/4" x 12 3/4" (unfinished).

Step 1

Cut the two 9" squares (A & D) in half on the diagonal. You will have two Triangles of each fabric and only need one triangle of each fabric.

If you follow instructions for one block, there will be a waste of fabric when cutting the triangles.


3-Grid

Step 2

Cut the six 5" squares (B & C) in half on the diagonal. You will have six triangles of each fabric and only need <u>five triangles of each fabric</u>.

Step 3

Layout the triangles according to the picture.


March block continued

Step 4

Sew a B to a C and press to the darker fabric. Repeat two more times.

Step 5


Sew a C to the right side of the unit you created in Step 4. Match the corners on the bottom together (you will have a ¼" bunny ear on the other side. Press to the outside triangle.



This is the top center unit.


Step 6

Repeat step 5, then on the right side of this middle center unit sew a B triangle matching the corner seam with the corner of the triangle. Press to the outside triangle.



Step 7


For the bottom center unit, sew a B triangle to the left side of the unit created in Step 4 while matching the corner seam with the corner of the triangle. Press to the outside triangle.



Bring your completed block(s) to the March meeting or the next meeting you attend. If you're unable to attend the March meeting, you can have a friend bring them on your behalf. You can also drop them off in the guild's basket at the Quilted Raven (top of the library shelf) no later than 3 pm on March 13th, and I will pick them up and bring them to the meeting. If dropping off blocks, please put your name on them so I can announce who made them.

QUILT CHALLENGE 2024/25 LUCK OF THE DRAWZ

The 2024 November Guild meeting revealed the 2024/25 Quilt Challenge, and 18 members signed on to do the challenge! Quilters will have until the June 2025 meeting to complete their submissions, which will consist of making two draws. You can still participate and complete your 'draws' at upcoming Guild meetings or contact Debbie to make arrangements outside of the meetings.

Each participant made two draws. The first draw was for the "Category," and the second was for the "Randomizer" item to incorporate into your submission.

There are 4 Categories:

Traditional Modern Scrappy Non-Quilt but Quilted Item

(cannot be a 'blanket' - could be an art quilt, table

runner, tea cozy, coat etc.)

The second draw was for the Randomizer item you must incorporate into your project. Randomizer items could be anything Quilty - a quilt block, a technique, a type of fabric, utilizing a quilting item, etc. There are 50 Randomizer items.

Judges will determine how well you incorporated the two together.

The Rules are:

- 1. You must incorporate your Category and Randomizer into your submission and reveal your challenge guilt at the June 2025 Guild Meeting.
- 2. Quilts must be made specifically for this challenge (existing quilts may not be repurposed for the challenge).
- 3. Submissions must be *quilted and finished no UFO's!
- 4. Quilts must be no smaller than 32" in circumference. There is no maximum size.
- 5. Members at the June meeting will judge how well you did!

For those of you who don't know, this is Sunbonnet Sue and she has not YET been drawn! Wouldn't she be fun??!


*Quilted means made of two layers of fabric filled with batting held in place with stitching.

Slow Cooker Chicken Enchilada Casserole

I saw this on my Facebook feed and thought it would be good. Let me know if you make it.

You will need:

1 ½ Ibs Boneless skinless Raw chicken breasts

28 oz can Red Enchilada Sauce (El Pato or Los Palmas)

10 Corn Tortillas (10-12 oz. package of soft)

2 cups Cheddar Cheese (divided) 3-4 oz. can Black olives (drained, divided)

Directions:

- 1. Put the chicken breast and the enchilada sauce in your slow cooker.
- 2. Cook on HIGH for 4 hours or LOW for 6-8 hours.
- 3. Shred the chicken with two forks right in the slow cooker.
- 4. Cut the tortillas into strips and add to the chicken and sauce. Stir.
- 5. Add ½ cup of cheese and half the olives into the sauce and chicken mixture. Stir again.
- 6. Flatten the mixture.
- 7. Add the rest of the cheese and the olives on top.
- 8. Cook on low for about 40 60 minutes longer.
- 9. Top with sour cream (optional).
