April 2025 Quilt Block

The Quilt Guild continues the Block of the Month series in our Sharing Gifts Program. This is our seventh block in support of our Sharing Gifts Program for the 2024/2025 season. If you are unfamiliar with the Sharing Gifts program, please review the policy on our website at https://ykquiltersguild.ca/about-us-1 (the link to the Sharing Gifts Policy is at the bottom of the Supporting Sharing Gifts page).

Our block pattern for March 2025 is called a **Children's Delight block**. This block is from the Ladies' Art Company Block Tool. I think this block will be fun with bright easter themed fabric.

Color Way: Choose 3 to 5 prints/solids, keeping the same placement of light and dark/bright fabrics as the diagram, and including a fabric that reminds you of easter or a bright colour(s). All fabrics can remind you of Easter.

What you need for one block:

A – four 2 ½" squares

B - four 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles

C – one 4 ½" square

D – two 2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangle

E - one 2 1/2" square

Block size should be approximately 10 ½" x 10 ½" (unfinished).

Step 1

For fabrics A, B, D, and E cut a 2 ½" strip into:

A into four 2 ½" squares

B into four 4 1/2" rectangles

D into two 8 ½" rectangles


E into one 2 ½" square.


Step 2

Cut fabric C into one 4 1/2" square.

Step 3

Layout the cut pieces according to the picture below.





April block continued

Step 4

Starting on the left, with the top row sew B piece to A square, then sew an A piece to the A/B unit. Press to the dark fabric.



Continue with sewing the pieces in next two rows together to form row 2 and 3.



Step 5

Sew E to the bottom of the upright D. Use a scant ¼" seam.



Step 6

Sew the three rows together (A/B/A units to the top and bottom of B/C/B unit). Then sew the D piece to the bottom of the unit just sewn together.

Step 7

Sew the D/E unit to the right side of block you created in Step 6.

Press.

Bring your completed block(s) to the April meeting or the next meeting you attend. If you're unable to attend the April meeting, you can have a friend bring them on your behalf. You can also drop them off in the guild's basket at the Quilted Raven (top of the library shelf) no later than 3 pm on April 10th, and I will pick them up and bring them to the meeting. If dropping off blocks, please put your name on them so I can announce who made them.

QUILT CHALLENGE 2024/25 LUCK OF THE DRAWZ

The 2024 November Guild meeting revealed the 2024/25 Quilt Challenge, and 18 members signed on to do the challenge! Quilters will have until the June 2025 meeting to complete their submissions, which will consist of making two draws. You can still participate and complete your 'draws' at upcoming Guild meetings or contact Debbie to make arrangements outside of the meetings.

Each participant made two draws. The first draw was for the "Category," and the second was for the "Randomizer" item to incorporate into your submission.

There are 4 Categories:

Traditional Modern Scrappy Non-Quilt but Quilted Item

(cannot be a 'blanket' - could be an art quilt, table

runner, tea cozy, coat etc.)

The second draw was for the Randomizer item you must incorporate into your project. Randomizer items could be anything Quilty - a quilt block, a technique, a type of fabric, utilizing a quilting item, etc. There are 50 Randomizer items.

Judges will determine how well you incorporated the two together.

The Rules are:

- 1. You must incorporate your Category and Randomizer into your submission and reveal your challenge guilt at the June 2025 Guild Meeting.
- 2. Quilts must be made specifically for this challenge (existing quilts may not be repurposed for the challenge).
- 3. Submissions must be *quilted and finished no UFO's!
- 4. Quilts must be no smaller than 32" in circumference. There is no maximum size.
- 5. Members at the June meeting will judge how well you did!

For those of you who don't know, this is Sunbonnet Sue and she has not YET been drawn! Wouldn't she be fun??!





Good luck with your challenges everyone!


*Quilted means made of two layers of fabric filled with batting held in place with stitching.


Dear Members,

You will need:

1 to 2 pounds beef round steak or stew meat

1 to 2 tablespoons vegetable oil 1 envelop (1 ounce) dry onion soup mix

2 cans (10 ¾ ounces each) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted Hot cooked egg noodles Chopped fresh parsley (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Time round steak and cut into cubes. (Partially freeze meat for easier cutting.)
- 2. Heat oil in large skillet over medium- high heat. Brown meat on all sides.
- Combine dry soup mix and canned soups in mixing bowl. Pour mixture into slow cooker. Add browned meat. Cover and cook on HIGH for 6 to 7 hours.
- 4. To serve, spoon over egg noodles. Sprinkle with parsley, if desired.
