Popular Toxic Plants for Pets

- Common indoor dangers: lilies, pothos, philodendron, and peace lilies
- Outdoor threats: oleander, azalea, sago palm, and tulips

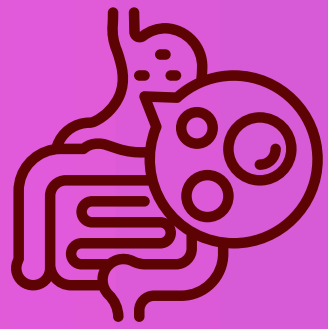
How Pets Encounter Poisonous Plants

- Chewing leaves, stems, or flowers out of curiosity
- Accidental ingestion during play or walks

Safety Tips for Pet Owners

- Keep **toxic plants** out of reach or remove them from your home and garden
 - Educate family and visitors about plant risks
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Recognizing Signs of Poisoning



Common Signs of Poisoning

- Watch for **vomiting, diarrhea, drooling**, or sudden lethargy
- Unusual behavior such as **tremors or seizures** may occur



Immediate Action Matters

- Early detection can be **life-saving** for your pet
- Contact your veterinarian or animal poison control right away



Monitor and Prevent

- Keep pets away from unfamiliar plants and monitor their environment

Preventing Plant Poisoning



Pet-Proofing Your Home

- Remove or secure access to **toxic plants** indoors and outdoors
- Use barriers or shelves to keep plants out of reach

Safe Plant Alternatives

- Choose pet-friendly options like **spider plants, bamboo palm, or cat grass**

Regular Safety Checks

- Inspect gardens and living spaces for new or unknown plants

Educate Family Members

- Share information about dangerous plants and symptoms of poisoning

What to Do in an Emergency



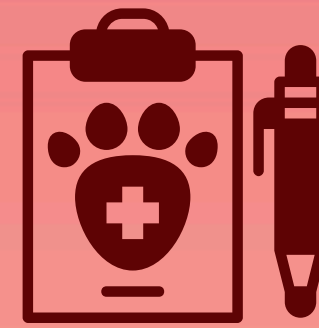
Recognize Signs of Poisoning

- Look for symptoms like vomiting, drooling, or lethargy



Remove Access to Plant

- Safely take your pet away from the plant and prevent further contact

Do Not Attempt Home Remedies

- Avoid giving food, water, or inducing vomiting unless instructed by a vet
