The 2nd Commandment

If you want to appreciate the 2nd Commandment, all you have to do is try to call your corporate insurance headquarters (or the large corporate entity of your choice) and try to get a hold of someone to handle a problem. After hitting various buttons, listening to terrible "muzak", and being put on hold, you will be well prepared to delight in the wonderful blessing the Second Commandment deals with – God's Name.



When we speak about God's Name we aren't just talking about sounds. You know God's Name - which means you have access to Him. You call upon His Name, and He will hear you. You don't have to go through phone trees, you don't have to repeatedly ask to speak to a manager. God simply hears you. Happily. Readily. In fact, God has baptized you, put His Name upon you. You are part of His family. Total and complete access to God, even after business hours! You take your problems to Him, and He will handle them in whatever way is best for you. Thus the gift of knowing God's Name.

However, our sinful flesh, with it's messed up fears and loves, will try to abuse this gift. Misuse it as we say today. Take it in vain - in an empty fashion - as I learned it in my youth. That's what leads to all the silly, flippant things the explanation to the 2nd Command deals with. Why would I need to curse – God is for me. Why would I make silly oaths or boasts – God is my Savior. Why would I need to try to work witchcraft or satanic powers or use a horoscope or any of that mystic mumbo-jumbo when the Creator of all things knows what I need? I certainly should never need to cross my heart and hope to die, especially over a lie!

And yet, we can forget (as the hymn puts it) what a friend we have in Jesus. We can forget that we don't need to work around Him, or feel bad for bugging Him, or try to go it on our own. Nope – God has revealed Himself to you, and He invites you to pray. In fact, He actually prays with you. Jesus tells us to pray "Our Father" because Jesus likes to pray along with you. Paul notes that the Holy Spirit will pray in you and with you all the time.

So – enjoy the gift. God likes to hear your prayer. He wants you to pray to Him. That's why our service is filled with prayer. (In fact pretty much every response the congregation makes, including the hymns – really, that's prayer to God – so go ahead and speak along and sing along.) God knows you, and He enjoys hearing you pray.



Kantor's Korner

August Hymn of the Month: "O Love, How Deep" (LSB 544)

Hymns can easily be taken for granted. We sing at least six every weekend service and we can often forget the hymns we just sang by the time we pull out onto Park Street after a service! Every month, I would like to spotlight a specific hymn to bring it off the hymnal page, providing insight that goes beyond the few stanzas we get to sing it.

"O Love, How Deep" holds a very special place in my heart. Back in sixth grade, this was the first hymn that really caught my attention. If I had to describe this hymn in one word, it would be "epic". At least, that's the word 12-year-old Caleb would use. Hymns written in a minor key are usually thought of as somber or serious (Consider LSB 450 - "O Sacred Head Now Wounded", written in the key of A minor). In hymnody, however, minor keys are used to notate strength and steadfastness (Consider LSB 578 -"Thy Strong Word", written in F minor). "O Love, How Deep" finds us in C minor, but also throws in A-flat notes in the second half of the hymn. Adding these A-flat notes creates major chords inside a minor key, resulting in a surprisingly... "epic"... sound. The other (much more important) component is the text. O Love, How Deep is a beautiful timeline of Jesus' earthly ministry, and flows right through His Passion and Resurrection. Most notably, the repeated words at the beginning of each stanza serves as a reminder of God's deep love "for us".

For US, He sent...

For US, He prayed...

For US, betrayed...


For US, He rose...

What an "epic" depiction of the love and mercy shown to us by our Father in heaven. *All glory to our Lord and God / For love so deep, so high, so broad!* (Stanza 7, Lines 1-2)

How quickly July flew! Summers are spent cleaning, organizing, then emptying and refilling the classroom, and no matter how long summer looks when we start, it shrinks at high speed. Before we know it, August is here, and we are getting our kids ready for school and the preschool ready for Open House.

Open House is the first time we meet many of our students. It is always interesting to see how they do when their parents step away for the informational sessions, leaving them in the classroom to play. Most have fun meeting their classmates and exploring the SUPER COOL toys, but there are usually a few who are sad or scared. Our teachers are great at comforting them and encouraging them to see the fun side of things! A class pet

is also a big help; a living creature makes an excellent distraction, and it sometimes helps children to vocalize their feelings by prompting them to tell adults about how they think the animal might be feeling.

Students aren't the only ones who feel nervous. Many parents are sending their child to school for the first time, and it can be hard for them to not worry about how their child will adjust to preschool. Teachers also cover a lot of information at Open House, making for a very full evening for the adults. This is one reason of many why we use the ClassDojo app to communicate with parents: they can send a message any time to ask for clarifications or address any concerns. Teachers like being able to present information in multiple formats, so this app makes life better for us, too!

Preschool has the earliest start date possible this year, so we will also be spending August preparing for the first day of preschool on September 2nd. I pray that teachers at Little Lambs and Herscher start the new year feeling refreshed and are blessed with eager students and smooth beginnings!

Jesus' transforming presence

"But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.' Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost'" (Luke 19:8-10 NIV).

Who knew, all those kids sitting in Sunday school were getting a lesson in stewardship! Generations of children have very often heard lessons based on the familiar account of Zacchaeus. The diminutive tax collector's curiosity surrounding the person and ministry of Jesus is what the Holy Spirit used to set him on a collision course for a total stewardship transformation. This transformation, according to the text of Luke 19, is not just about this life. This stewardship transformation is about eternity as well!

Remember the story: Zacchaeus was a tax collector. Do not think of friendly neighborhood IRS agents. This was more like a toll booth operator, but the governing authorities did not set the toll. They would contract men to staff roadside booths and tax the commerce that was passing along the road. This was an enterprise full of greed and graft. The tax collectors would take as much as they could and only pass on a portion to the government. The rest did not go into the community chest either! It went into the pocket of the tax collector.

This is why the people had such disdain for Jewish tax collectors. They were seen as both crooks and traitors. They were crooks in that they extorted their compatriots and others in the toll process. But worse, they were seen as traitors because their efforts supported the occupying Roman authorities. That is the real reason that the people would not make way so that short Zacchaeus could see Jesus.

For this reason, he runs ahead and climbs a tree. He had heard all the stories. He wanted to see this Jesus with his own eyes. Mercy is on display. This hated crook and traitor gets a direct audience with Jesus — at Jesus' own request! Jesus invites Himself to Zacchaeus' house. This is where the transformation is about to take place!

Notice how Jesus does it. He does not preach a three-week sermon series, nor does He ask Zacchaeus to make a pledge. There is nothing programmatic about Jesus' approach. But Zacchaeus is completely transformed! The transforming force is the very presence of Jesus! Direct time with Jesus takes a crooked, selfish, criminal and makes him the most faithful steward.

This new life of stewardship is marked by the promises made. First, he gives half of his ill-gotten gains to the poor. These are people whom he would not have defrauded at all! Yet, after spending time with Jesus, they are His first concern. Only after this does he double the requirement of the Levitical law on fraud. And what does Jesus say is the result? Salvation!

Doing the acts of stewardship does not save. Rather, the faith in Jesus that is created by the Holy Spirit is what saves! This is critical for us to confess. Failed stewardship can and will cut you off from God. The only antidote for failed stewardship is the presence of Jesus.

We do not need to run ahead and climb a tree for this presence of Jesus. He makes Himself available to us every week in the Divine Service. He speaks His Word of invitation to us in the pages of Holy Scripture. This, and this alone, transforms us from sinner to saint, from owner to steward of all that belongs to the Lord.

Do you want to become a more faithful steward? Spend more time with Jesus. Make the Divine Service a weekly priority. Feast on Christ's body and blood weekly! This is the great gift that brings salvation from God's House to yours!
