The First Commandment – Understanding Satan's Attacks

Perhaps the very first lesson you had in Confirmation Class, or at least the first thing you were supposed to memorize was the First Commandment and it's meaning: You shall have no other

gods (Thou shalt have no other gods before Me). What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. I hope you have this committed to memory, and frankly I hope you use this every day, because there is no better or more simple tool for understanding how you get tempted, how Satan attacks you.

Consider you belong to God. God has redeemed you, Jesus has won you salvation upon the Cross, the Holy Spirit dwells within you. You belong to God. The goal of every sin, every temptation is to try to separate you, to scare or lure you away from God. Hence

the first commandment – get all that junk that tries to get between you and God outta here! In the explanation to the First Commandment, Luther explains very simply the ways in which temptation tries to shift us away from God – via misplaced fears, loves, and trusts.

Consider fear. Being afraid will make us do silly, stupid things. Satan will use fear to try to drive you away from God. Satan will try to make something seem bigger, more powerful than God so that you listen to that thing rather than God. So day by day, when you feel fear and worry rise within you consider whether this thing you fear (which may be very real and very powerful) is more powerful than God Almighty who loves you and who has redeemed you. (Hint: it's not. Don't let Satan drive you into folly.)

Consider love. God gives us many great blessings, but Satan will try to twist how we view those blessings. Satan will tempt you to treat the various blessings as though they are more important than the God who gave you those blessings. In other words, Satan will try to get you to love other things more than God. So, consider the good things you have. Are you using them (loving them) according to how God wants you to? Are you prioritizing them above God – don't do that. It twists a gift from a blessing into a idol.

Consider trust. Our trust is to be in God above all things. Our hope is in the Name of the Lord Who made heaven and earth. Satan will try to shift you to where you trust in things or yourself (your own thoughts, your own wisdom) rather than God and His Word. Be wary of this.

With the idea that we are to fear, love, and trust in God above all things, you have a simple and full pattern to examine every action or decision you make, to understand how you approach every relationship you have. The rest of the 10 Commandments are really just fleshing out this idea, showing ways in which Satan will use misguided fears and loves to tempt you. Avoid those temptations, and when you see also the ways in which you've foolishly blundered into temptation, remember that Christ Jesus is your Redeemer and forgives you those sins.



Kantor's Korner

The following is a "get to know me" bio from our new Kantor.

"Caleb Dehning attended the DePauw University School of Music in 2014, and transferred to Concordia University -Chicago to finish his degree in 2018. While at



DePauw, he performed with the University Band as a tuba player, and used hymns from TLH, LW, and LSB to assist his music theory and counterpoint lessons. With Concordia's Wind Symphony, he held the Principal Tubist position for 3 years, and served Head of Band Staff for 2 of those years, touring with the ensemble around the U.S., Canada, and South Africa. His self-study emphasis was in Film and Church Music, writing and playing hymn settings for Chapel worship services, and performing in hymn festivals at churches around Chicago, IL, St. Louis, MO, Indianapolis, IN, Denver, CO, and Tucson, AZ. He also hosted a weekly radio show on 88.5 WCGR called "Settling the Score", where he analyzed and critiqued film music.

His primary instrument is Tuba and his secondary is Voice. Organ and Piano were never in his arsenal, but he continues to work through liturgy, 4-part hymn-playing, and organ method books daily to achieve the level of keyboard performance proficiency required of a Lutheran kantor. His favorite hymn is "What Is This Bread?" (LSB 629)."

Little Lambs Preschool



It is time for another edition of Preschool FAQs! This time the subject will be Ginger, our class pet.

What kind of lizard is Ginger, and how old is she?

Ginger is a bearded dragon. Bearded dragons are native to Australia (though Ginger is captive-bred) and need a desert-like climate: warm temperatures, low humidity. That's why she needs heat lamps. Those lamps also provide her with the UV light she needs to correctly process the nutrients in her food for healthy bones. As for age, we can't be totally

certain. She was adopted from Copper's Friends bearded dragon rescue, and they thought she was about two when we got her in October 2024. Two is considered adult age for bearded dragons.

She's redder than Pumpkin. Is she a different kind of bearded dragon? Will she get bigger? No, she's the same kind of bearded dragon. There are eight different species of bearded dragon, and based on my research, I'd say Ginger is a central bearded dragon (Pogona vitticeps), which is the most common pet bearded dragon species. Their color is variable, allowing them to blend in with the dirt where they live, and the pet trade has probably bred them to show more vibrant colors (you will read of different color "morphs"). Ginger probably won't get much bigger since she's an adult.

What does Ginger eat?

Ginger's diet is comprised partly of greens and partly of insects; adults need more greens than insects. Her favorite greens so far are turnip, curly mustard, and cilantro. Her food must be low in oxalic acid, because oxalic acid binds with calcium to create a different compound. Too many greens high in oxalic acid would mean her body wouldn't get the calcium it needs for healthy bone growth. Sorry, Ginger, no kale for you. As for insects, my favorite feeder insects are dubia roaches. They are lower in chitin (the hard stuff that makes up the exoskeleton) and more nutrient-dense than many other feeders. They are also pretty cost-effective. However, if needed, she could also eat crickets, superworms, or different caterpillars like hornworms or silkworms. Whatever she eats gets a special diet high in calcium, and I have vitamin powders I can dust them with just before she eats them, too.

Where will Ginger go on breaks?

For short breaks, she will stay at the school. For summer break, I am probably going to bring her back to my house (unless I am not going to be home for a while). It makes caring for her a bit easier. Regardless of where she is, she needs time out of her enclosure to run around. The classroom is her "territory," and she is quickly establishing the hallway beyond as hers as well. She loves to explore those areas!

Doesn't she get lonely living alone? She should have a friend!

Bearded dragons are not social animals- that is, they don't live in groups. Males and females will briefly mingle for mating purposes, but that's it. Bearded dragons lay eggs and bury them, leaving them to hatch on their own. If I tried to get Ginger a friend, she would almost certainly attack the other lizard. She has at least attacked her own reflection and made it known that the classroom is HERS, so that mirror lizard can just back off! She's not even all that keen on people yet. She does enjoy some gentle petting, though, and we give her food, so she guesses humans are okay. They are certainly interesting. She enjoys watching people during the school day. But another lizard would be a very bad idea.

Faithfulness: The Stewardship Standard

"Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found faithful" (1 Cor. 4:2).

What is the standard to which a steward is held? Ask the average person, and they might talk about percentages, tithes, and commitments. Too often, the default mode of measuring stewards is by how much and how frequently they give. This is not helpful. Measuring activity without any connection to baptismal identity is a recipe for disaster. It can either breed a sense of superiority and self-righteousness or create a culture of scarcity and despair. Neither outcome is godly or helpful.

This is not to say that stewardship should be regarded as "no big deal." St. Paul, within his discussion of the ministry to which he has been called, sets the standard of accountability for the steward: faithfulness. This removes any sense of superiority or self-righteousness and dispels scarcity and despair. When a steward manages what the Lord has entrusted to them — resources and all aspects of life — for God's purposes, the focus is not on how much or how frequently they give.

This standard reflects the stewardship portrayed in the Gospels where Jesus entrusts varying amounts, each according to ability. The commended stewards were recognized for their faithfulness in their vocation, not the amounts they managed. Conversely, the condemned stewards were not castigated for their lack of performance but for their lack of faithfulness.

What does this mean for the steward in the pew? The Lord has entrusted you with various things. Luther captures them in his explanation of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed and the Fourth Petition of the Lord's Prayer. The familiar couplets of food and drink, house and home, spouse and children, land, animals and all possessions are the Lord's, and He has entrusted them to you for His purpose. This trust brings an active realization of thanksgiving.

This active thanksgiving is our stewardship. It can be distilled into two questions that the steward regularly needs to answer:

- 1. How has God blessed me?
- 2. How is He calling me to respond?

The first question is quite simple to answer: if the Lord has entrusted something to you, it is a blessing. This blessing is for God's glory and the benefit of your neighbor. The second question is more challenging to measure; it is not about percentages and charts. Instead, it is about a life of

thanksgiving that flows from the mercies of God revealed in Jesus Christ. This thanksgiving starts at and flows from the cross and the empty tomb. Our stewardship of the Gospel drives our stewardship of everything else.

The standard, then, is faithfulness. Faithfulness flows from eyes focused on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith. It does not come from our efforts but through the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives, through Word and Sacrament. It begins at the altar in the Divine Service but extends into the world — from hearth and home to workplace and classroom, from commerce to leisure. The mercy of God, freely given in Jesus, leads us to demonstrate a faithfulness that reveals to others the same mercy we have received in Jesus.

This faithfulness cannot be measured empirically. It is simply allowing the Holy Spirit to work in and through us for the glory of God and the benefit of our neighbor. Weekly. Daily. Faithfully.
