The 6th Commandment

The most nervous I have ever seen my father was when I was in Confirmation Class as a 7th grader. My father was on his vicarage at St. Paul's in Waco, Texas, and as part of his duties he had to teach a Confirmation Class, and I happened to be in that class. We got to the 6th commandment, and he has to teach, and my classmates were there... but also I was there. He was so nervous, especially because so often 6th commandment issues can be strange or gross or how does this fit with age appropriateness and on and on.



Here we are in December. It's advent time. We get to talk about Joseph and Mary. This sort of gets to the point of the explanation of the commandment — We should fear and love God so that we may lead a chaste and decent life in word and deed, and each love and honor his spouse. Yes, I went back to the old fashioned translation — in the modern version instead of "chaste" they use "sexually pure" - but here, maybe it's Christmas nostalgia kicking in, but I like the old fashioned wording. Instead of the contrast between pure and awkward impurity that is rampant, maybe we should ponder being chaste, being decent. Doing right by others and valuing them, especially in relationships.

Ponder the respect that Joseph and Mary show each other throughout all the stories we get this month. The goal, the desire that God wants for us is for husband and wife to love and honor each other. And that's a great thing. But so much of what goes on in the world around us really fights against this. In fact, the first temptation in Genesis 3 really is an attack against Adam and Eve honoring and loving each other.

There's something to learn from these nativities we see, where Joseph and Mary both are in postures of care and concern. There's respect there. There's devotion there. That's the point. Instead of taking and using, the two who are given to each other in marriage give of themselves to each other. And that runs so harshly against our "what's in it for me" culture.

Of course, the fact that this is so hard for us is precisely why the Father gave His only Son. It's why Jesus would give His life for us. Jesus likes families, and He is born and lives precisely to restore the family of God for all eternity.


Kantor's Korner

December Hymn Spotlight: "Come, Christians, Join to Sing"

If you attended this year's Council of Church's Community Thanksgiving service, you may have noticed that the choral anthem sung by the combined church choirs wasn't... exactly... "Thanksgiving-y". Usually, when we think about Thanksgiving music, we think "harvest", "fruits", or giving thanks "with a grateful heart", etc. What could this "Come, Christians, Join to Sing" song POSSIBLY have to do with Thanksgiving?

Short answer: Everything.

"Come, Christians, Join to Sing" cannot be found in our Lutheran Service Book hymnal (*Gasp!*) I know, I know, bear with me! - This hymn was written by Christian H. Bateman in 1843, draws on Scripture texts from Psalm 95, Ephesians, Hebrews, and Revelation, and mostly



appears in Presbyterian and Methodist hymnals (*Gasp!*) Stay with me! The hymn was also added to the most recent printing of "Christian Worship" in 2021, which is used by the Wisconsin Synod today. (*Gasp!*) Hey, Trinity Lutheran Church even used the former publication of "Christian Worship", so you can see the very small degree of separation between us and this hymn, despite its absence from LSB!

This was the first Community Thanksgiving service I was able to be a part of since becoming a member of Trinity a few years ago. Truth be told, our church hosting in my first year as Kantor was a daunting task. However, during the combined choir rehearsal the week before, something very interesting happened. As we put the finishing touches on the music, and ran through the piece fully, I couldn't help but get excited as I fully realized exactly what was happening. We, the choir members of Trinity Lutheran Church, and they, the choir members of Herscher United Methodist Church, had come together to sing this piece. In short: We, Christians, "joined to sing". What a joyous blessing for both our churches! In that moment, I realized that while selecting this choir piece might not have *directly* dealt with the usual Thanksgiving themes, the execution created exactly what the day represents:

A chance to give thanks for God's countless blessings - Both small daily blessings, and major blessings, like the opportunity on one random November Sunday night in Herscher, Illinois to hear a combined choir of Christians making a joyful noise to our Lord together, in unity.

Little Lambs Preschool



The lead-in to Christmas is a busy one for preschool. We have so many Christmas-themed projects to complete! But aside from being cute, what are our students actually learning? Believe it or not, they are learning a great deal. They are learning to use glue sticks, liquid glue, and how to apply tacky glue with a paint brush, all of which are important in school and also develop their fine motor skills. When they fill their paper bag mangers, they are learning to estimate volume. Using stamps on their gift bags helps them learn how to apply appropriate pressure and improve their hand-eye coordination. They are also anchoring the Bible stories they learn with physical things. They place a star at the top of their manger like the star that guided the wise men to baby Jesus. Their hands are turned into angel wings and their faces affixed to the angel robes they decorate, because like the angels that announced the birth of Jesus, they can also share the Good News.

They learn to give to others as they make gifts for their parents and pick books for our classroom gift exchange. They also learn to consider others' points of view. Which book would a friend at school like? What colors do my parents like? All of these are valuable skills, developmentally and scholastically.

Our preschoolers finish the short month with a performance for parents. As we practice during school, they learn to sing together, matching the pace and pitch of each song. They learn how to match movements to rhythm. We sincerely hope they learn enough spatial awareness to not fall off the risers! Just in case, we give them a couple practice runs first and move anyone teetering to a lower level. Public performance is also a skill, and many are inexperienced. We understand if someone is too shy to stay on the risers. Most importantly, the kids learn again that Christmas is about the birth of Jesus. It's a short but sweet evening for our preschool families and anyone else who would like to attend. We will be looking for people to assist with refreshments that evening; if you are free on December 18th and would like to volunteer, contact Mrs. Brown.



School will then be out of session until Tuesday, January 6th. We wish our students and their families a merry and blessed Christmas as we celebrate the birth of our Savior. May God bless us all in the new year, too!

- No expiration dates
- Many companies offer electronic gift cards (instant delivery available)
- Nation-wide brand coverage

In the hope that our shipping costs do not exceed the rebates we receive, we will be promoting RaiseRight less often than we used to, though it WILL still be available to you year-round. As Christmas approaches, we can be confident that the volume of orders will be sufficient to cover shipping, so we want to invite you to use this opportunity to order with us! Members of staff use them as gifts not just for Christmas, but birthdays or other special occasions throughout the year. We also purchase gift cards to locations where we shop regularly or worry about card skimming, such as gas stations.

You can request a list of vendors or place an order through Mrs. Hart in the church office, or e-mail trinityher1@comcast.net for an enrollment code to order online. Orders placed online may be paid for by credit card (3% fee) or debit card (1% fee), or you may submit a payment in cash or check to Mrs. Hart. Please make checks out to Trinity's Little Lambs Preschool. After the orders are submitted (Mondays only), physical gift cards will be delivered to the church at no additional cost to you. To ensure delivery before Christmas break, orders should be placed **no later than 11 AM Monday, December 8th.** A current list of vendors is available in the parish hall. While it does show the rebate the preschool receives, again, this is not a fundraiser, and that should not factor into any orders you place. We merely wish to extend the opportunity to use this convenient service for your gift card shopping needs.

LCMS Stewardship Ministry – lcms.org/stewardship Newsletter article – December 2025

"We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves" (1 Thess. 5:12-13).



Have you finished your Christmas shopping yet? Do you have a person or two on your list that you just don't know what to give them? While I know you are running short of ideas...dad doesn't really want another tie, and your kid's teacher doesn't need another coffee mug. It can be nothing short of maddening to try to figure things out in the middle of this busy season!

As stewards of all of life and life's resources, we know that life is more than giving gifts. We stewards never want to take anything the Lord provides for granted. During this season of Advent and Christmas, it is a great idea to do whatever you can to be a faithful steward of your pastor. Even more so than the rest of the year, the demands on their time, their presence and their stewardship of the Gospel in the congregation become heightened.

The demands on pastors can wear them down and wear them out. How does the steward in the congregation serve as a faithful steward of the treasure that is their pastor? Here are a few ideas:

- Put them at the top of your prayer list. Pray that the Lord guards them against the weariness that makes them susceptible to the work of the devil.
- Make worship a priority St. Paul admonishes the Thessalonians and us to respect those who labor among us. There is no greater way to steward your pastor than to respect him enough to show up and receive what he has been sent to offer in the proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the Holy Sacraments.
- Be receptive to his work If your pastor is tasked with calling you to repentance or encouraging you to be in worship, know that he is only caring for your soul.
- Esteem him highly Take the time to thank him for his faithful service to Christ, the congregation and your family.
- Be at peace This is an easy time for even minor annoyances to get blown out of proportion and become full-blown conflict. This not only spoils the season of Advent and Christmas, but it also spoils our stewardship of the Gospel and those who serve us in that Gospel. Remember that Jesus came into the world to be the Prince of Peace. This is an act of grace and mercy. The steward seeks to reflect this toward their pastor and their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Stewardship at Christmas can be a challenge. Stewardship of your pastor during this time of the year is critical to our shared stewardship of the Gospel at a time of year when many are more open to hear and receive it.
