Colossians – Jesus is Important

One of the great dangers to our faith that we may come across is that we just get bored. We get bored of the Gospel, we get bored of Church, we get bored of Jesus. We think we know it all already, and we want something novel, something "exciting and new". We



and we want something novel, something "exciting and new". We can get distracted easily in search of this excitement, and we can get lost in the weeds.

This actually is nothing new. As Paul is writing to the Church at Colossae, they are facing the exact same ho-humness, and more over, there are false teachers who are peddling false teachings that are shiny, gleaming and very attractive. All these false teachings do the same move – they push Jesus and His Cross off to the side and dangle something else before our eyes, hypnotizing and mesmerizing us.

So Paul writes the letter to the Colossians, and in this letter Paul refocuses us upon Christ Jesus, but does so in a way to reawaken our wonder with Christ. It's not that Jesus is boring, it's not that the Church or the Gospel is boring – the problem is that our familiarity with Jesus and forgiveness can breed contempt. So Paul has us look at Jesus with some fresh eyes of wonder, pondering the things we may easily overlook.

Paul notes that Jesus is "the image of the invisible God, the first born of all creation. For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible...." (Col 1:15-16a) Whatever you want to ponder, whether it's deep things about God, whether it's about creation – Jesus is at the center of it. If you are to understand God, it's through Jesus. If you want to understand creation, it's Jesus' creation – He's the One who made it and runs it. Don't let people push Jesus out of the picture, because there's nothing that He isn't really at the heart and center of.

This includes your own life — "For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory." (Col 3:3-4) Everything in your life—the works, the vocations, the neighbors you are given—these are all things that come from Christ. It might not be obvious (that's the "life is hidden" aspect), but it's there when you ponder, when you see things in terms of Christ. You don't need to run after the latest Christless trend – there's more than enough wonder and mystery in who you are in Christ Jesus.

So if you ever are feeling bored or sluggish regarding the faith, if the sense of wonder is lacking, give Colossians a read. It's quick, but it is profound and wonderful. Have a wonderous month in Christ!

Little Lambs Preschool



Spring has sprung, and our April themes definitely reflect it. First and foremost, everyone's favorite project starts at the beginning of the month: the hatch project! Mrs. Orr will once again be resuming her role as Master Hatcher. This year we are being extra ambitious and planning a double hatch with a second incubator and some new equipment. We can't wait to see if there is any impact on hatch rates! There will be about a week's delay between the start dates of the two batches. Once hatched (starting the third week of April), chicks will remain at the preschool for about a week before being adopted out to students and their families. Be sure to follow the church Facebook page for updates and (hopefully) some

livestreams of hatching chicks! It takes a mere twenty-one days for a fertilized egg to develop into a hatched chick, and we get sneak peaks at their progress when we candle the eggs. Is there anything better than watching the growth of new life to drive home the wonder of God's creation?

Building on the animal theme, we will also have a unit on pets. Students' families are invited to bring their well-behaved pets to visit the class, which is always a treat! Dr. Beth has also graciously invited us back to tour her clinic, weather permitting. Students get to learn about all the ways she and other vets help their pets, and they may even get to meet one of the furry clinic denizens! We are grateful to Dr. Beth and her clinic staff- especially Heather Thurston, who handles the logistics of our trip- for making this wonderful opportunity possible.

Rounding the theme off, we will be studying the butterfly lifecycle by hatching caterpillars into butterflies (the start date of this project depends on the weather). Butterflies often appear in Christian symbolism as reminders of Christ's resurrection and ascension, both of which feature in our Bible lessons this month, tying it all together.

Aside from our animal projects, students will be getting ready for promotion and graduation on the 9th of May. As with our past events, we will be looking for volunteers to help set out and serve refreshments. Promotion begins at 10:15 AM and graduation at 6:00 PM, with some light preparation beforehand; if you would like to help out, please call or text Celia Brown at (815) 954-9962.

We are grateful that we never seem to find ourselves short of help. This sometimes takes of the form of volunteers at our events, or maintenance of the preschool space and equipment; other times, it is monetary donations. 
Parish Hall Rental/ Property Check-Out List

Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.



Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are *his*: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership *to you*? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since *you* belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.
