Ephesians – A Simple Primer

This month we will consider Paul's letter to the Ephesians, which holds a special place in my heart. 20 years ago this summer, when I showed up at my first parish fresh out of the Seminary, I had to pick something to teach in bible study. I picked Ephesians – and as that congregation had bible study before service, the very first official thing I did was teach a study on this book.

But why Ephesians? Ephesians is an incredible valuable book because it is unique among all the letters Paul writes. In every other epistle there is a specific problem that Paul is addressing, but in Ephesus, nothing is going wrong. This lets Paul write a simple letter that serves as a great, basic overview of the Christian faith and life. It serves as a simple primer for what how one is saved and the impact Christ's salvation has upon us.

As an example of this, Ephesians 2:1-10 is the great passage about salvation being by grace through faith in Christ Jesus. Verses 8 and 9 are the kicker – For by grace you have been saved, through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. Here Paul can be direct, and he doesn't need to really focus on any point over and against local tomfoolery.

In Chapters 4-6 Paul goes on to explain how this grace that God has given manifests in our lives together. Chapter four speaks to the unity we have in Christ and how we are pulled away from sin. Chapter five speaks to how we love our neighbor, especially as husband and wife. And then, in Chapter 6 we get the famous "whole armor of God" passage, which will be the theme for our Lenten midweek services.

So if you ware wanting something straightforward to read and be refreshed by, I highly recommend sitting down and reading Ephesians. It's a quick read, much of it will be familiar to you, and it's quite edifying.

Little Lambs Preschool



The last newsletter mentioned that January is typically the coldest month with the most snow, and it certainly did not disappoint this year. Thank you to Brian Noffke for your spectacular snow management! Thank you also to the properties committee, who arranged for the furnace fan to be replaced. The fact that the water heater failed mere hours before the furnace appointment and was therefore ALSO handled in a supremely timely fashion may have been unintentional, but we are grateful to you for fixing it nonetheless.

Something I am asked on occasion is how we handle snow days at Little Lambs. The answer is that we follow the Herscher school district, with one slight change: no e-learning. When COVID-19 necessitated the closure of schools across the nation, we implemented e-learning in an effort to keep in touch with our students and help them feel less isolated during lock-down. We still feel that was the best option available in a difficult situation and cannot rule it out as something we'd do in the future (should we be closed long-term again). However, for short-term closures such as snow days, we consider it a blessing that we are able to allow students to truly be out of school. Preschool is heavily designed around social, emotional, and motor development; could we find an electronic task that would meet that need better than playing (hopefully with others) outside in the snow? Even on the bitterly cold days that keep our preschoolers indoors, they will be interacting socially with caregivers and/or siblings. It is hard to be little, so in this respect, we are happy to let them have it easier than the big kids.

As we move into February, with Valentine's Day and Grandparents Day celebrations, we will be talking about love and family. Our Bible lessons this month will be focusing on the ways Jesus helped people, and what He teaches us about caring for others. Love is an action. It certainly makes us feel many ways, too, but we ultimately show love best by serving others. This will set the stage for Easter, when God's perfect love for us is demonstrated with Christ's death upon the cross. It may seem like a lot to wrap your head around, but that is why God tells us to have faith like a child: they don't have to fully understand to trust that God loves and forgives them.

Have a blessed Lent, and may we all have faith like preschoolers!



One was just gifted and has not been used as of yet. The other two machines have been used to bind quilts every meeting day. We currently have forty-four finished quilts boxed, and around 10 in various finishing stages. We have been blessed with flannel liners and some hospital blankets. We have four bolts of cotton batting to use in the future also. One was a family donation and three were purchased with a donation from a Church member.

In reading on LWR website we realize some of our quilts are not warm enough for the areas they are being sent. This is why we have purchased the batting. We will continue to use light blankets and flannel sheets also.

We sent 176 quilts to LWR last fall and 132 school kits. We cannot do this without the support of our church family.



Caring for My Neighbor

If any of the Ten Commandments might tempt us to think that keeping the Law is easy, it would be the Fifth Commandment. After all, how hard is it to get through life without murdering somebody? The vast majority of people can handle that!

But Jesus famously blows up this notion by pointing out that the command, "you shall not murder," goes much deeper — down to the heart.

You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be



liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. (Matt. 5:21–22)

Hatred and disdain come from the same sort of crookedness of heart as murder. With both murder and hatred, you look down on another person and think them of little worth.

In the Small Catechism, Luther also points out that every "do not" in the commandments also includes a "do this:" "We should fear and love God so that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body but help and support him in every physical need" (SC, Fifth Commandment, emphasis added).

We are not called merely to avoid evil; we must also do positive good.

So when Jesus drew near to us and became our neighbor by taking up our humanity, He came not only to avoid harming us, but He came to positively help us, bless us and serve us.

We are now called to show the love to our neighbors that Christ showed to us. Your neighbor is yet another gift that God has given you that requires your stewardship. We are called to show mercy, to be kind, to love and serve our neighbor. One aspect of this stewardship is financial: our neighbors need us to support the church's work so that they can hear the Gospel and come to faith. Our neighbors need the church's alms and mercy work. Our neighbors need our faithful service in all we do in the name of Christ.
