2 Timothy – Paul's Pastoral Will and Testament

In the Scriptures there are a few times we get a second letter, and when we do, it's generally because something really bad has happened. With both Corinth and Thessalonians, Paul's first letter led to confusion and hurt, which required a second letter to clean things up. This is understandable – some problems don't get fixed with only one letter.



2 Timothy is different. Whereas 1 Timothy is Paul simply instructing the youthful Timothy about being a pastor, in 2 Timothy there is more weight, more urgency. This is because, quite simply, Paul is about ready to be executed for the faith. Paul is no longer the older pastor giving advice to a young, fellow pastor — Paul is talking to the guy who will take over after Paul himself is dead. It's no longer fatherly advice; it's dad speaking from his deathbed.

As such, 2 Timothy drives to the point of what Timothy is to do and not do as a Pastor. Timothy is to remember that he has been ordained to preach the Gospel, that he is to "fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands" (2 Tim 1:6). You've been called into business of preaching – so don't wimp out and do it. Preach the Gospel, don't be ashamed of it. Protect the truth and defend it. Tell your people what is important – keep the focus on Jesus.

Keeping the focus on Jesus means you'll have to set limits for yourself and for your congregation. Paul reminds Timothy that he'll have to "charge them not to quarrel about words" (2 Tim 2:14). There are some discussions and debates that we could have, but really have nothing to do with Christ and Him crucified. When those happen, it's the job of the pastor to say, "this isn't an argument we need to have." Timothy himself is to have, "nothing to do with foolish, ignorant controversies" (2 Tim 2:23). Your job is to be a speaker in the Church – be very careful about what you choose to speak about.

That's the point. Preach Christ, even as people fall away, as things go wrong. Preach the word, and stay there for as long as the Lord gives you days to preach. Keep your congregation focused on Christ too. Because everything else is dross, and for when we meet our maker, Christ and Him Crucified is what's going to matter. 2 Timothy is poignant and lovely, and for me as a Pastor it reminds me what standards I ought to hold myself to (and what you as a congregation ought to hold me to as well).

Little Lambs Preschool



It's time to answer some questions I am occasionally asked about preschool and what happens over the summer!

Where does Pumpkin go over summer? What does she think of summer vacation? Pumpkin, as I am sure most of the congregation knows, is our preschool class pet. She is a bearded dragon lizard that Little Lambs got from the Ruels as a baby back in 2019. She has grown quite a bit since then! Pumpkin stays at the preschool for VBS then goes to stay with Pastor and Celia. Otherwise, she finds the long stretches of no people or activity pretty boring. This also helps us empty out the classroom so that the floor can be

cleaned and waxed for the next school year. Bearded dragons are native to the Australian Outback, so they need living conditions that are dry and warm/hot. That means she really likes getting a chance to bask in the sun outside before the corn gets high and makes things humid! She thinks birds are scary, so she prefers to have someone sit next to her to keep her safe.

What do you have to do over the summer to prepare for next year?

Most of the tasks involve cleaning and organizing. The end of the year is very full: chicks, Easter, Mother's Day, graduation, plus our regular weekly unit themes. That means we have a lot of storage bins we are pulling from all at the same time, translating to a lot to put away when we finally finish! Then there are special tasks, like reorganizing books or music. We also inventory supplies to make next year's supply lists and a summer shopping list.

From a director perspective, there are field trips and special days (e.g., picture day) to schedule for next year so we can make our yearly calendar. Toward the end of July, we send out an invitation to Open House as well as the calendar, supply lists, and important information about how each class works. Then we set the classroom up for Open House at the end of August.

Who takes care of the playground and handles repairs?

I try to handle small repairs for things like toys or tightening a loose screw here and there. But most of the heavy lifting, so to speak, is done by the church Properties Committee. They are wonderful about handling things quickly and efficiently! Big jobs requiring lots of people require some additional volunteers. For example, when the playground mulch was expanded and replenished, we had a large group of church members helping to move and spread it.

What do you do about summer student birthdays?

We celebrate every student's birthday. When we have a summertime birthday, we try to celebrate a halfbirthday. For example, if a student has a birthday on May 29th, we try to schedule it around November 29th. Occasionally, we are on vacations for both the actual birthday AND the half-birthday, in which case we ask the student's parents when they would like to celebrate.



The Rewards of Godliness

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God ... in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:23).



So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5–6)

What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be? Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land'" (Eph. 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake: "Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life" (Matt. 19:28–29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.
