Mudcats The Mudcat's took on the Wolfpack this week and they came away with a 15 to 11 victory because every time the Wolfpack base runners Tried to take an extra base the Mudcats would gun them down. Top hitters: Mark Johnson 5/5, Matt Alberti and Doug Johnson both went 2/3.

Outlaws-The Outlaws scored multiple runs in 7 of the 8 innings and stayed ahead the whole game. It was a team effort with every player getting at least two hits and 8 of the 10 players getting 2 or more rbi's. Bob Frey was the outstanding hitter today going 5 for 5 with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run and 6 rbi's. There were some fielding errors, but the Outlaws took a step in the right direction on defense. David Gerds made some outstanding stops at 3rd base. Bob Frey pitched the entire game.

Rovers- The Rovers were bounced by the Warriors 20-19 in the bottom of the 9th. The Rover's top hitters were: Stephawn Thompsen going 5-5 with a double and 2 RBIs, Tony Camillo going 4-5 with 3 doubles, a triple and 4 RBIs, and Dennis Romero going 4-5 with 2 doubles and 3 RBIs. Warriors- Wow, what a game. After our pitcher (let's not name him but it's the guy writing this report) gave up 8 runs in the top of the 9th, the Warriors needed a miracle.
