## Managers Notes:

**Mudcats** The Mudcats faced the Cardinals this week, and after two innings, they held a 7-6 lead. However, in the third inning, the Mudcats surged ahead by five runs, and they maintained that lead throughout the rest of the game. Terry Pryor hit two home runs and drove in seven RBIs, while Selwyn Quan had an exceptional performance, going 7-for-7. Despite their efforts, the Cardinals couldn't seem to get Quan out. Tim Larson, Doug Johnson, and Mike Smith all had outstanding performances, going 5-for-6. On the defensive side, Selwyn Quan made several impressive catches, and Pat Kieling provided excellent coverage in right field. Mark Johnson once again demonstrated his prowess in the infield, leading the team to a decisive victory against the Cardinals with a score of 25-16.
