Managers Notes:

Do-Over-Rovers The Rovers' bats were hot, producing a dominating 26-2 win against the Warriors, who were missing some key players. (No, I'm not referring to Klay Thompson.) Perhaps the catalyst was the new team shirts crafted by Ellen Seiji. BTW, Ellen was 4 for 4 and played outstanding defense. Tony Camillo continued his MVP campaign, going 4 for 4, with 2 doubles, a triple, a home run, and 5 RBIs. Danny Bejarano, Mark Narciso, and Dan Burbank were all 3 for 4, and Mark hit a homer. Tom Wagenseller (no, he doesn't sell wagons or Volkswagens) was 3 for 3, with a home run and a walk. Brian Wong was 3 for 3, with a triple and a walk. Ben Brack was 2 for 3, with a walk. La'i Faleafine showed her switch-hitting prowess, going 2 for 4, batting left-handed! Roy Camillo was 2 for 4, and feeling frisky, ran for himself and scored a run. Obviously, when a team holds their opponents to 2 runs in 9 innings, the pitching must have been outstanding. Joe Serochi pitched 6 great innings.

Outlaws Final score Raiders 21 - Outlaws 20. The Outlaws started slow, falling behind to the Raiders 14-3 after three innings. The Outlaws scored 17 runs in innings 4-7 to take a 20-18 lead after 7 innings. The Raiders scratched out 3 runs in the final two innings to take a 21-20 lead going into the bottom of the 9th inning. The Outlaws needed 1 run to tie and 2 to win, and started off the frame with a Mark Reclus single. After a infield popup, Mike Sousa hit a double to move the potential tying run to 3rd base and the winning run to 2nd base with just one out. The Raiders (wisely) walked John McCown to load the bases and set up a force out at every base. The next Outlaws batter hit a hard ground ball to the Raiders 3rd baseman who stepped on the bag and threw home for the game ending double play. Hitting standouts for the Outlaws include Rich Mills 4 for 4. Malia Frey 3 for 3. Mike Sousa and Marc Reclus were both 4 for 5. John McCown, Randy Cobb, Mace McDonald and Bob Frey were all 3 for 4. Mark Childress was 3 for 5. The Outlaws neglected to turn in a game report for 7/9. In that game, the Rovers beat the Outlaws 28-16. Outlaws hitting standouts from that game include: Mark Childress 4 for 4. Ray Watkins and Bob Frey 3 for 3. Mike Sousa, John McCown, Marc Reclus were all 3 for 4. Lee Schreiner, Mace McDonald and Randy Cobb were all 2 for 3 plus a walk.

Raiders Another game of three parts: Raiders dominated early, taking a 14-3 lead after three innings. Then Raider defensive lapses (and good Outlaw hitting) allowed the Outlaws to come all the way back and take a 20-18 lead into the eighth with all the momentum and the hammer waiting in the ninth. But

the Raiders scratched across a run in the eighth and two in the ninth to take a precarious one run lead at hammer time. The Outlaws got the tying run on third and the winning run on second with one out and hot hitting John McCown up, who had already sent two balls to the right field fence. But we walked McCown to set up a force play everywhere. The next hitter fell right into the trap, and hit a sharp grounder to third baseman Don Devencenzi, who niftily stepped on the bag and tossed to catcher Jim Dietrich and it was game over.

It was truly a team game - everyone in the lineup had at least one RBI. Mike Mooney, who had a nice running catch in the first inning, led the way, going 5-5 with two doubles. Chris Hernandez joined him at 5-5 and tied for the team lead with three RBIs. Devencenzi was 4-5, and Manager Jay Sankey was 4-6 and chased down one of McCown's blasts at the fence for the catch of the game. Don Ott also drove in three runs (as did Dietrich), and ran to the left field line from his SS position to rob someone of a hit in the sixth. Finally, after Gidget Blaquera started the eighth with a nice running catch, Hernandez and Ott turned a neat 1-6-3 double play, with first baseman Steve Brown picking the throw to first out of the dirt. This held the Outlaws scoreless in the inning and set up the game winning rally in the ninth.

Warriors Warriors were held to 2 runs while the Rovers scored 26. Our best effort hitting came from Steve Castillo, 2 for 2. Doug Johnson, Tim Larson, and Miloe McCall (with a double), were 2 for 3.
