

JOB DESCRIPTION

Job Title: Instructional Coordinator

Reports To: Chief Executive Officer, MI-RAMP

Mission:

MI-RAMP is looking for a dedicated and experienced <u>teacher</u>, who is <u>Certified for</u> <u>grades K-8</u>. This new position-- Instructional Coordinator-- is for MI-RAMP's pilot 20-week all Saturdays program. The preferred candidate will also have administrative experience, such as:

1. supervising other teachers and

2. performing objective assessments, monitoring achievements and summarizing progress of students.

Position Description:

Candidates will only be considered if they can show strong indications of prior achievements in enhancing student success. For example, having demonstrated and learned effective techniques to augment teacher-student rapport, trust and mutual respect. Those relationships positively affect teaching and learning. This professional candidate must be able to recognize student self-confidence, enthusiasm and learning. Student learning must be quantifiable, monitored, measured and documented by the combined efforts of the classroom teachers/tutors and the person holding this position. This Instructional Coordinator should spearhead those combined efforts. Additionally, good candidates should have skills that encompass all aspects of the 'Teacher/Tutor' as described in that JOB DESCRIPTION, which is <u>Appendix A</u> (attached to/enclosed with this document).

Essential Job Functions:

- Establish curricular guidelines akin to syllabi for each Group (A, grades K-2; B, grades 3-4; C grades 5-6). day-to-day curriculum matrix
- Monitor outcomes (See examples, mi-ramp.org), such as:
 - vocabulary growth, numbers of words recognized and understood, ability to read, ability to read to learn and comprehend,
 - ability to count by 5's, 10's, knowing addition/subtraction/multiplication/division facts, understanding positive

versus negative numbers, conversions (decimals to fractions to percentages), interpreting simple graphs and trends in data

- thinking critically (Does it make sense?),
- \circ $\;$ displaying respect for self and others,
- appreciating and accepting those who are different
- Assure that meaningful work is scheduled and taught each day in those day/time slots that currently are shown as TBD (to be determined)
- Teachers/tutors should primarily complete the TBD sections work for each day. Suggestions and input from the Instructional Coordinator might be needed and should be provided when needed.
- Assure that classroom content is done in a logical/appropriate manner and in a sequence that provides for good transitions, easy learning and provides proper foundational information (For example, must learn how to do addition before subtraction).
- Write and summarize results from nine (9) evaluations of students (3 pre-evaluations for Groups A, B and C; 3 mid-evaluations for Groups A, B and C; and 3 post-evaluations for Groups A, B and C)
- Write and summarize results from nine (9) surveys of parents (3 pre-surveys of parents in Group A, 3 mid-surveys of parents from Group B and 3 post-surveys of parents from Group C)
- By end of the semester, write three separate sets of outcomes for Groups A and B and C.
- Submit the outcomes summary to the Executive Board CEO with any general conclusions, recommendations for changes in future Mi-RAMP programs, specifically the one slated to follow the pilot program. Summary should also include strengths and weaknesses of the program and testimonials and impressions/suggestions/conclusions from parents.

COMPENSATION:

\$35/hour (paid 3 hours per Saturday (\$105 total)—No required classroom time but occasional visits expected. No teacher/tutor evaluations. Working hours 9am-12 noon on the twenty (20) Saturdays of MI-RAMP classes. Other days listed in Appendix B as i, ii, iii are considered 3-hour blocks at home or at HUMC. Those rates will also be \$35/hour.
