On small orders (**10 copies or more**), Fedhealth provides FREE peel & stick labels with verbiage you'd like conveyed to recipients. (*We can customize books in the print process but it may take months to deliver – please call for more details.*)

Many agencies, businesses and nonprofits use free labels on our **standard red books** to include local contact data, logos, emergency phone #s, special protocols or procedures, grant-specific data, shelter locations and other messages needed to personalize paperbacks for their respective area.

We can do 1 or 2 labels per book -- even a 3rd or 4th one if needed - whatever's best for you.



We ship labels separately so your group gets to decide where best to place them on/in books.



The LaSalle County Animal Response Team's membership is comprised of large animal veterinary specialists, small animal veterinary specialists, licensed veterinary technicians, food animal owners, horse owners, and small animal specialists, county animal control, county public health department, as well as members of volunteer agencies.

The team was organized in 2006 under the leadership of the LaSalle County Animal Control Administration. The year 2007 saw the team become active. In 2007 the team was deployed on three occasions. The first deployment involved an overturned cattle truck on I-39, the second deployment involved removing animals from a flooded barn in Sheridan during the flood emergency in August, and the third was an attempt to capture a cow running loose along I-80.



The CERT program was developed to augment, not replace local response capabilities by training citizens to be prepared at home and work for emergencies and, if affected by a crisis or disaster event, to respond appropriately within their own home, neighborhood and workplace.

Emergencies or disasters can occur any time of the day or night on any given day. Available CERT volunteers can be activated by LaSalle County or the State of Illinois to provide support to response and recovery efforts within the jurisdiction, or state. They can also be called upon by the county to augment events that use volunteers to support event operations. Trained members have received basic training from personnel in the areas of disaster preparedness, fire suppression, first aid, light search and rescue, team building, and the incident command system.



The LaSalle County Ground Search and Rescue Team is a group of trained volunteers that assist local and state emergency response agencies in the search for missing or lost persons in all weather and terrain types. Team members are on call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The team is trained to conduct both day and night time searches for both people and evidence, however, they do not search for subjects who are considered armed and/or dangerous without law enforcement personnel.

Are You Prepared?

CERT - Community Emergency Response Team Training

This **FREE** Emergency Response Training is offered several times each year at a convenient location in the Cy-Fair Community. It is an 8 - week course which meets one night each week from 630pm to 930pm. A training manual, safety vest and starter backpack of supplies is provided to each student and there is **NO COST TO YOU!** These classes are provided by grants to the Harris County Citizen Corps and each session is taught by professionals in their field. Upon completion of the course, each participant receives a certificate and photo ID issued by the Fire Marshal's Office.

Class Topics Include:

- Disaster Preparedness
- Small Fire Suppression
- Basic First Aid and Triage
- Light Search and Rescue
- Disaster Psychology/Team Organization
- Terrorism Awareness

A final class wraps up everything covered in the course with a fun and educational Disaster Simulation Drill.

CERT training is designed to prepare you to not be a victim and to be able to help yourself, your family and your neighbors in the event of an emergency or disaster. For more information about the program, go to www.harriscountycitizen corps.com. (CERT)
