Glenmaire's Premier tour, unlike all other tour offers, is a full-service operation that:

Who is this tour suitable for?

This tour is suitable for anyone with a reasonable level of fitness. The distances you cycle each day are relatively short, typically 30 - 40 km with some extra options. However, it is important to note that the routes are very hilly. For this reason, we recommend using an electric bike.

Do I need to be a regular cyclist?

It is important that you are a competent cyclist (as distinct from a fit cyclist) with adequate bicycle handling ability and a proper knowledge of the rules of the road. It is not recommended that you book a cycling holiday unless you have cycled at least occasionally before you arrive.

Will I be cycling along with others?

No – this premier tour will only include those in your group, your guide and your support vehicle. At busy times of the year June/July/August it is possible that others will be following the same routes, but we will endeavor to choose those routes less traveled. In the quieter months when numbers are smaller it is quite possible that yours will be the only group on the road at that time.

Is this tour on cycle paths or public roads?

For the vast majority of this tour you are on roads that are also open to traffic. However, we focus on small back roads where the traffic is almost non-existent in most places. There are some short stretches on roads with moderate traffic. However, even here cycling is not difficult.

Are the routes hilly?

The routes on this bike tour are VERY hilly (this is partly why it is so beautiful!)! The gradient varies constantly from gentle to very steep. On an average day of cycling 40 km you can expect an elevation gain of approximately 400 metres (1,300 ft). For this reason, we recommend using an electric bike for this tour.

What is the best time of year for a bike tour in Ireland?

Our tours run from Late April to September. There are advantages to coming at different times within that period. In Spring and Autumn, roads are generally quieter. Although it can still be quite cold in April/early May, and towards the end of September, these can be great times to travel if you simply come prepared for the weather.

During May and June, flowers bloom and there's an abundance of foliage. Young lambs are to be seen playing virtually everywhere and the days are really really long.

In the second half of August, the heather is in full bloom, covering the hills with a magnificent purple carpet.

Photographers say that September is the best month for light and color.

Our best advice is to come when it suits you best. There's so much to see and do at all times of the year. You really won't be disappointed.

What is the weather in Ireland like?

Our climate is mild. This is because the North Atlantic current of the Gulf stream protects Ireland from extremes of climate. It's not uncommon to get sunny dry weather at any time of the year, although rain is also common. Showers are often localized, which means that you may have a showery morning but a sunny afternoon along your route! In summer, most rain showers don't last very long, so light rain gear that you can fold up and use when needed should leave you ready for all eventualities.

The peak season is July and August, but the weather can be just as good, or sometimes better, earlier or later in the year.

The average summer daytime temperature is usually between 15°C (59°F) and 22°C (72°F). On rare occasions the temperature can approach 30°C (86°F), however Ireland never experiences the extreme temperatures seen in many parts of Europe in recent years.

What type of Bicycles and E-bikes are provided?

Hybrid bikes:

Our partners with their 10 years of experience equipping biking tours, have carefully chosen what they consider to be the perfect bicycles and e-bikes for touring in Ireland.

Bike Features:

- 3 x 9 Speed Shimano gearing. With smooth shifting and a huge range of gears this is the perfect combination to tackle Ireland's varying terrain.
- Shimano hydraulic disc brakes. Designed for reliability and smooth operation, giving the peace of mind that only comes with top of the range components.
- Schwalbe Marathon Plus tires. Allowing you the freedom to explore knowing that you are riding on the world's leading puncture resistant tires.

Our partners have a range of sizes so there is always one to fit you. They also have men's (with crossbar) or ladies (step-through) bikes available.

Electric Bikes:



The Thompson Enigma is one of the best e-bikes currently available. This is why our partners have opted to use it as the perfect partner for Ireland's undulating terrain. The Enigma features the world leading Bosch Active Plus drive system and full Shimano gearing and Hydraulic disc brakes.

E-bike Features:

- Bosch Active Line plus motor. Smooth, quiet and offering 50Nm of assistance this is the world's leading ebike motor in its class.
- Bosch 500 wh battery. No need to even think about whether your battery will last throughout the day. Rest
 assured it will!
- Shimano Alivio 9 speed gearing.
- Shimano Hydraulic Disc Brakes giving smooth reliable stopping power.
- Unisex Step-through frame model for easy mounting and dismounting.
- Schwalbe Marathon Plus tyres. The world's leading puncture resistant tyre.

What Equipment/Accessories are provided with the bikes?

Bikes are supplied with everything you will need during the day on your bike tour including*:

- Front waterproof handlebar bag with map holder (7 litre capacity.)
- Rear waterproof pannier (20 litre capacity.) We can provide a second pannier free of charge on request.
- Lock
- Repair kit. Containing: Spare inner tube, puncture repair kit, tire levers, multi-tool, pump, 15mm spanner.

Should I bring my own helmet and high-visibility clothing?

Yes. If at all possible, please bring your own helmet and high-viz vest or top. However, we understand that as helmets are bulky they are sometimes difficult to pack. In this case our partners will supply you with one of our helmets free of charge. They will also provide high-viz vests if you do not have your own.

Can I bring my own pedals and saddle?

Yes! Our partners will happily fit them to your bike for you.
