Dear Family Promise of WNY Community,

This has been an exciting year for our family shelter program. Most notably, we relocated the Family Resource Center to downtown Buffalo, situating us closer to the families we serve and the services they need to regain independence. The logistics of homelessness are far from simple, and we aim to make this journey as manageable as possible by positioning ourselves geographically in a place that makes sense for our guest families.

In October, I joined as the new Executive Director. Prior to Family Promise, I worked as a tax accountant in New York City. After three years in the corporate sector, my focus shifted towards community development and I relocated to the Federated States of Micronesia, a developing Pacific island nation, where I spent one year volunteer teaching. It is with great enthusiasm that I return to my hometown of Buffalo and begin the next chapter with this transformative program.

Our Case Manager, Denise Morse, remains with Family Promise of WNY, and we are thankful for her wisdom and experience as we forge ahead. Denise works with our guest families, past and present, connecting them to critical services they need to achieve self-sufficiency. We also continue to rely on our beloved Van Driver, Paul Flammer, whose loyalty and sense of humor are tenets of the program.

As an accountant, I am a numbers person. Initially, it seemed impossible that two full-time employees and one part-time employee could run a family homeless shelter program. That is when I learned about our incredible network of volunteers. In 2016, Family Promise of WNY volunteers provided hundreds of thousands of dollars in-kind labor and food donations. This incredible community solution to homelessness inspires me daily, and we are fortunate to have these dedicated, service-minded individuals supporting our mission.

As we evolve to address the current challenges faced by families experiencing homelessness, we will continue to stay true to our core values of family unity and community service. Together, we are the solution to ending family homelessness.




