Note from the Director

WOW! What a year!

2021 brought its shares of joys and challenges but overall this was a completely unique year in so many ways!

First and foremost, 2021 was the first full year that we operated a static-site shelter with twice the capacity of our old model. We jumped from serving 20 to 40 families annually.



As a benchmark to indicate how fast we had to grow, our staffing costs increased this year by over 200%. Everything intensified - we had to prepare bigger meals, purchase more bedding, manage more children in the building and respond to more needs from our families. **But our community was with us 100% of the way!** YOU increased your support of our program through donations of funding, groceries, shelter supplies and essential support, keeping us strong for the families we serve.

We finalized many building modifications this past year to keep up with our census, including expanding our kitchen to give our families more space to cook and store food, installing a commercial washer and dryer to help laundry flow more efficiently and partnering with two brilliant artists in our Buffalo community who **painted inspirational murals inside our shelter space.** I want to thank our muralists, Casey Milbrand and Cassandra Ott, for their gorgeous contributions to our walls!

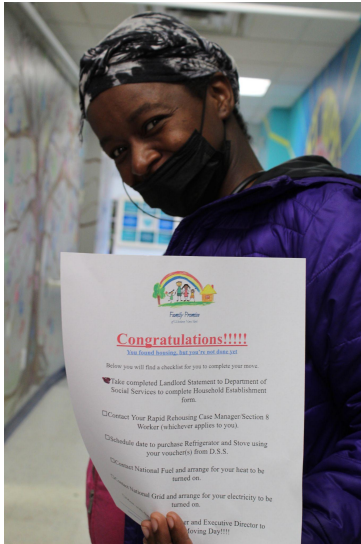
This year also showcased the efficacy of our small-scale shelter model. Serving only 6 families at a time allows us to build relationships of trust and collaboration and tailor our interventions to the family in front of us in order to empower them to succeed. Check out our stats from this past year:



55 days = the average length of stay in our shelter

30 = families in our program who transitioned to stable housing situations

0% = families in our program who returned to homelessness



That “0%” recidivism rate is significant. On top of just housing families, our team hustles every day to help our guests achieve their stability goals - anything which would increase the likelihood that their family will remain housed. These goals include helping parents secure employment, recovering lost documents like birth certificates and social security cards, activating cell phones, connecting families to primary care doctors and mental health counselors, enrolling children in school, fixing broken-down vehicles, etc. While we’d love to see every family who enters our program move into an apartment, **what “0%” recidivism indicates is that our wrap-around interventions were strong enough with every family who passed through our doors that they were able to stabilize enough to successfully exit out of the homeless system.**

Of course, 2021 was overshadowed by the COVID-19 pandemic. Family Promise kept our doors open through an entire year of this unrelenting public health crisis. COVID impacted our shelter in profound ways. At the beginning of 2021, Buffalo Public Schools were in full remote learning and we started the year by hiring a Virtual Learning Coordinator with funding from the Vogt Family Foundation. This new staff position was created to help our families more successfully manage the unique demands of virtual learning until students transitioned back into classrooms in the Spring. Although New York State had an eviction moratorium in place this past year, we noticed that our census in shelter was constantly full since early summer. The need for shelter is urgent. Once a family successfully navigates our program, it has been much harder to convince landlords to take a chance on renting to our families because of the way the moratorium has essentially blocked landlords from collecting rent or evicting tenants. Certain families have been “stuck” in shelter for too long after meeting all their goals except housing. And although we have continued to prioritize safety in the building with facemasks, frequent temperature checks and constant sanitization, **the pandemic has been a constant threat in our shelter and I applaud my staff for coming to work each day and allowing us to stay open for business.**

This past summer, we piloted our first in-house summer camp to much success! Homeless children have difficulty accessing traditional summer camps due to the unpredictable nature of the crisis itself and the lack of resources available to families experiencing homelessness. Family Promise of WNY opted to pilot our own 6-week in-house morning summer camp powered by funding from the Marks Family Foundation and focused on reading, math, socio-emotional development, arts and gross motor development. We even sent our children on a field trip every Friday! **It was wonderful to see kids have a chance to just be kids in shelter and give parents some freedom to get to appointments and focus on their priorities.** We hope to secure funding this coming year to make the summer camp into a full day program!



Despite COVID, we have also been able to welcome volunteers back in the building when positivity rates across Erie County have been low enough to permit this. Some highlights include partnering with Colleen Culligan who has been a constant source of bicycles for our families this past summer and coordinating with over 69 community donors to secure Christmas presents for 39 of our families this past holiday season!



We also made some significant partnerships this year, including with the generous women at **Park Edge Chocolates** who stepped up as our local chocolatiers for our 6th annual Choctoberfest in September and with **Scott Bieler of West Herr Automotive Group** who donated a 2019 minivan to our program in December. Wow Scott - what a gift!

Finally, this past summer we kicked off a year-long celebration honoring Family Promise of WNY's 25th anniversary in this community! The festivities began with a homecoming on the grounds of the shelter, which included an official ceremony, a long-overdue ribbon-cutting and then a summer picnic complete with a food truck, a bounce house and face painting! Throughout

our anniversary year, we are encouraging all our supporters to join **"The Village" - a community of monthly financial donors** - which helps strengthen the financial health of our program. **Check out our website for more details and stay tuned for more anniversary celebrations in 2022!**

This has been an exciting year full of unique challenges and opportunities and 2022 is shaping up to be just as critical. **As I write, the eviction moratorium in New York State has just expired and over half a million renting families are in danger of eviction from back rent owed.** Our community is on the precipice of a homelessness surge, making organizations like Family Promise of Western New York as critical as ever. I want to thank our community for their support in these difficult times and ask that you stick with us as we make the road ahead!

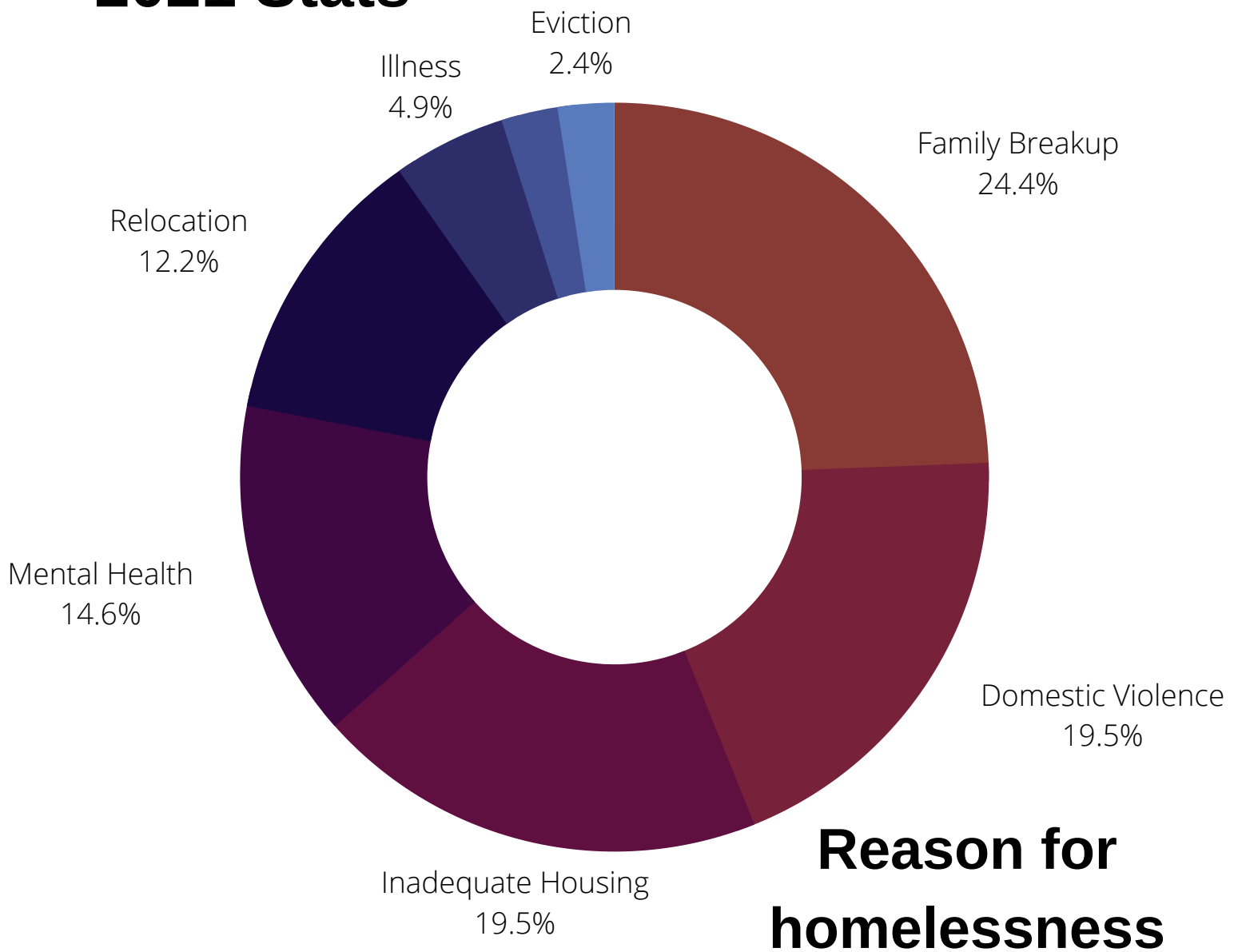

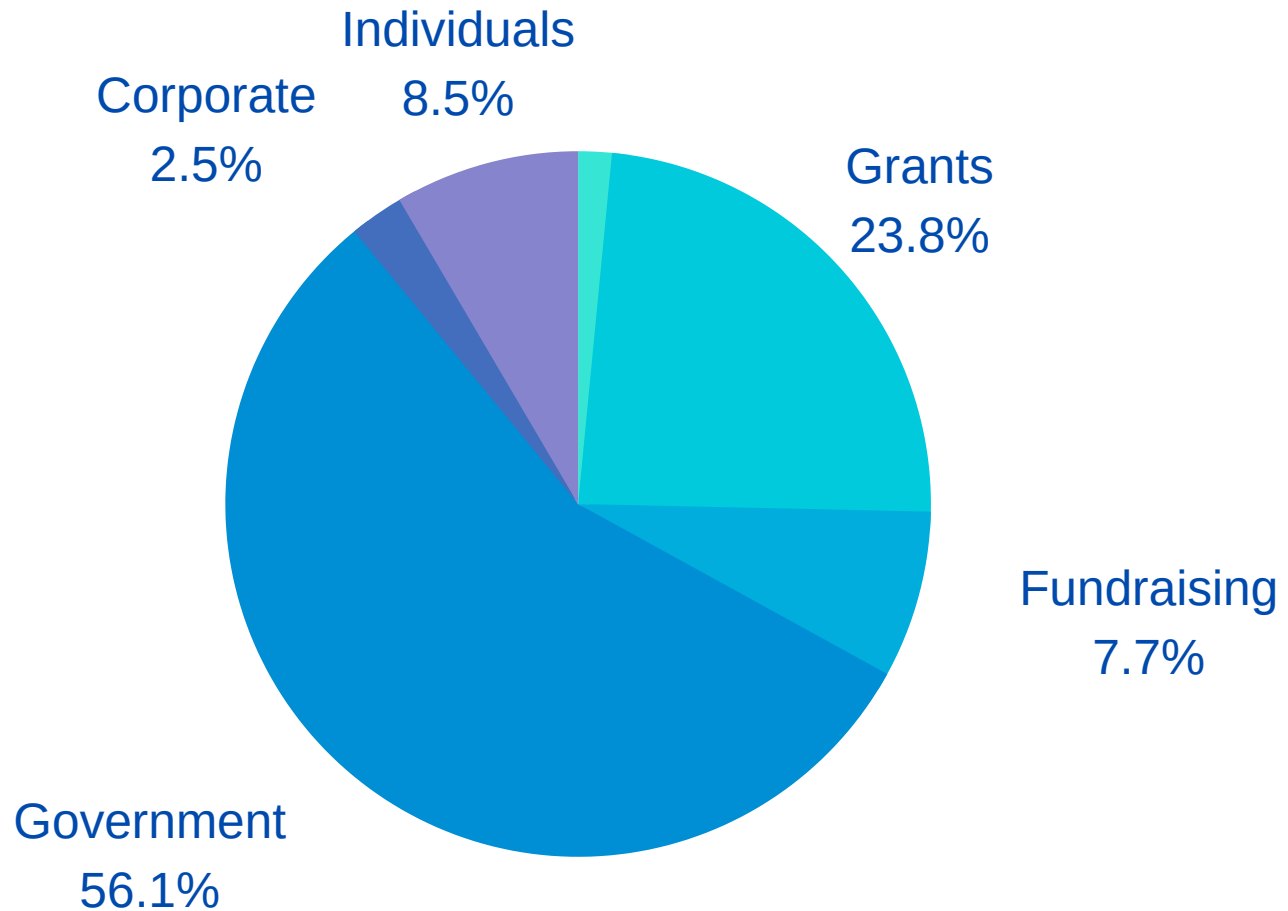


Average number of days in shelter

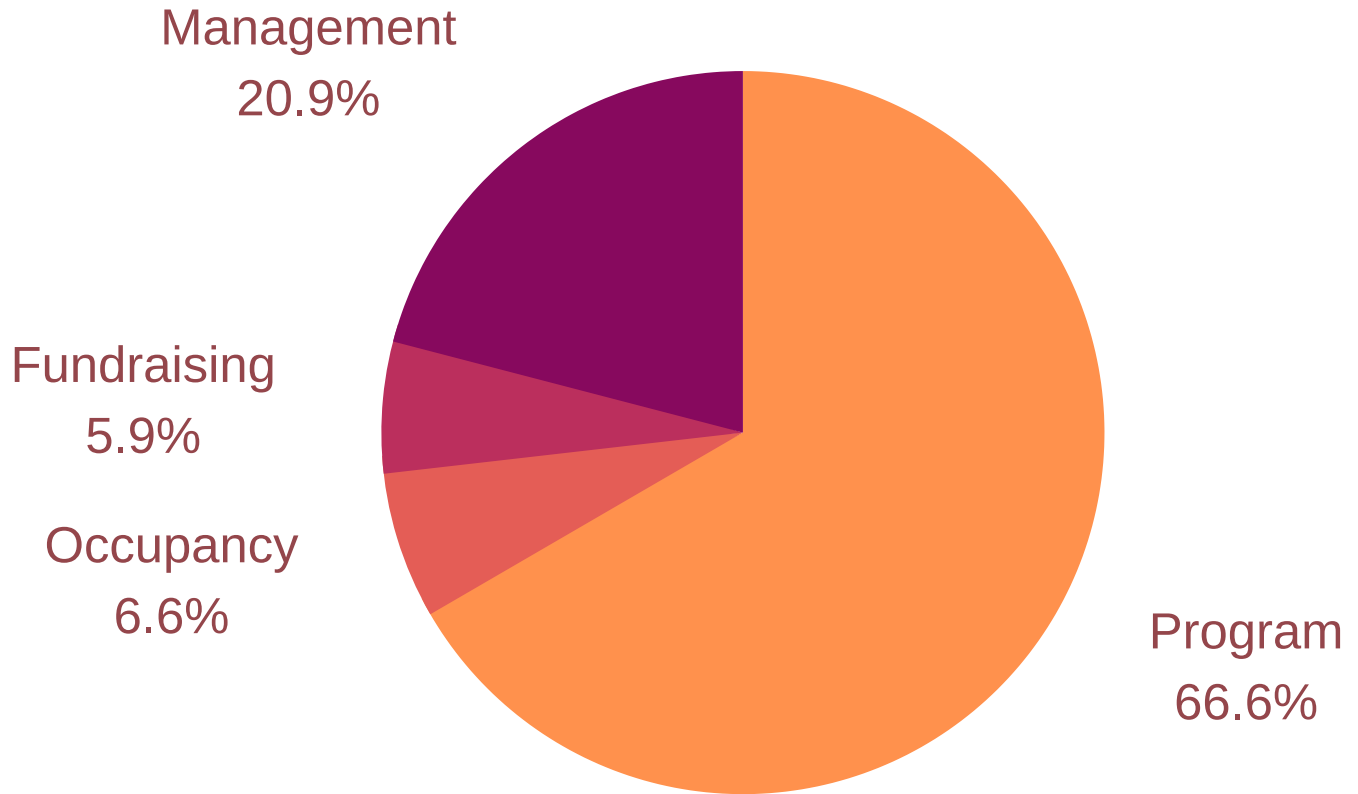

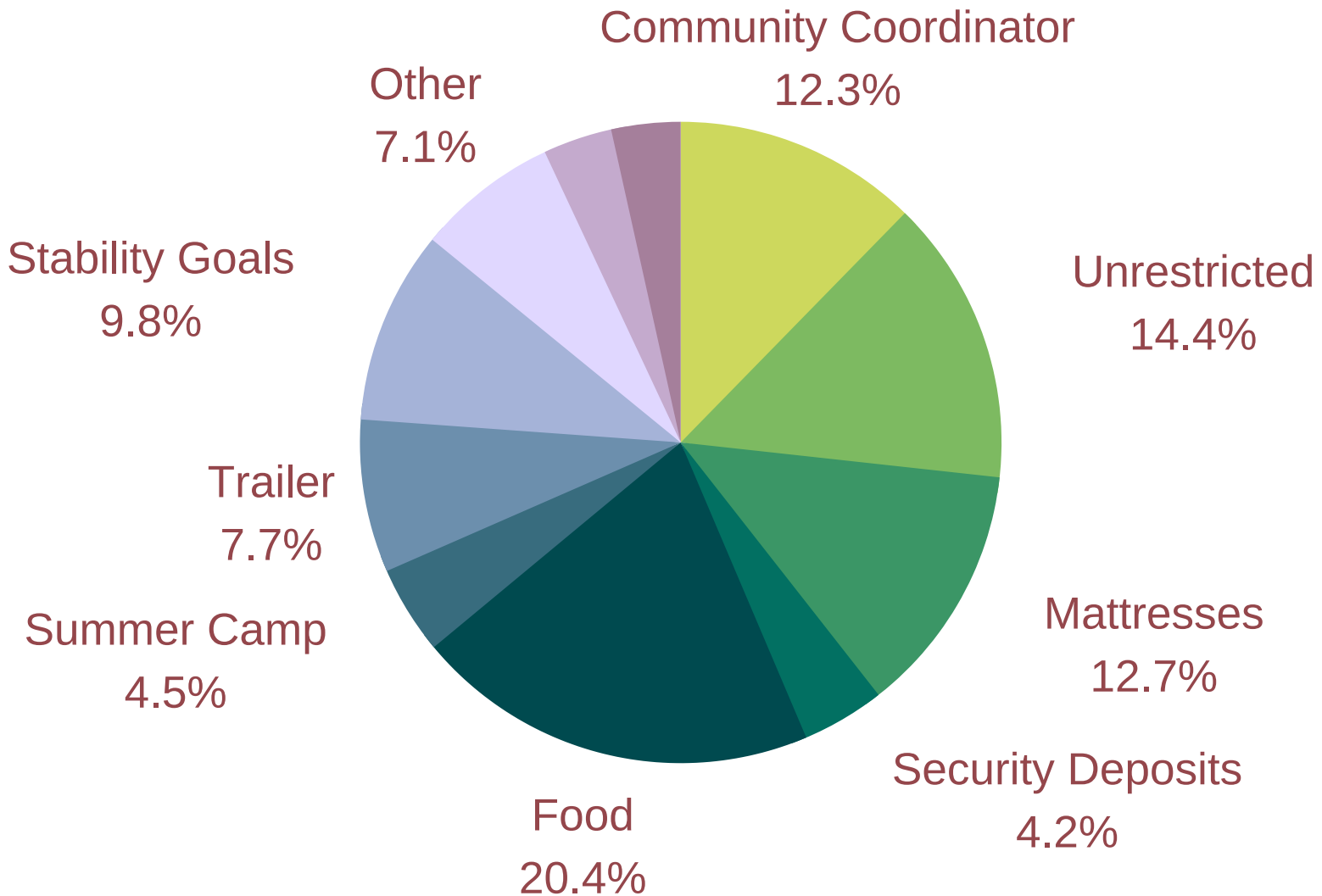
2021 Expenses
