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Oxford Place Description and History

Oxford Place is located in beautiful Fort Mill, South Carolina and only a few miles from nationally ranked public schools as well as the North Carolina border! Nestled close to upscale shopping, dining, entertainment venues, Charlotte Douglas International airport, and award-winning medical facilities, this subdivision is located in the perfect place!

Truly, there is no place like the York County neighborhood of Oxford Place. The neighborhood consists of custom built, all brick or stone homes, side load garages and at least an acre of land for each property owner. With mature trees and long driveways, Oxford Place has acres of rolling, green forests, blooming flowers, large yards, walking trails (leading to neighboring Massey) and a neighborhood park that is perfect for kids to play and for adults to socialize.

Oxford Place was initially created by Homestead Land and Timber Company in the late 1990s. In October 1998, the first lot was sold at the end of a cul-de-sac on White Chapel Court. Construction started shortly thereafter. In June 1999, the first lot sold on the West side of the neighborhood at the end of Croyden Court. Of the 106 total lots, there are 85 homes in Oxford Place West and 18 houses in Oxford Place East. As of 2019, there are two undeveloped sites in Oxford Place West and one last lot in Oxford Place East under construction.

The Oxford Place Property Owners Association (OPPOA) was formed in July 2001 when the developer held the initial homeowners meeting and turned over responsibility of the neighborhood to the property owners.
