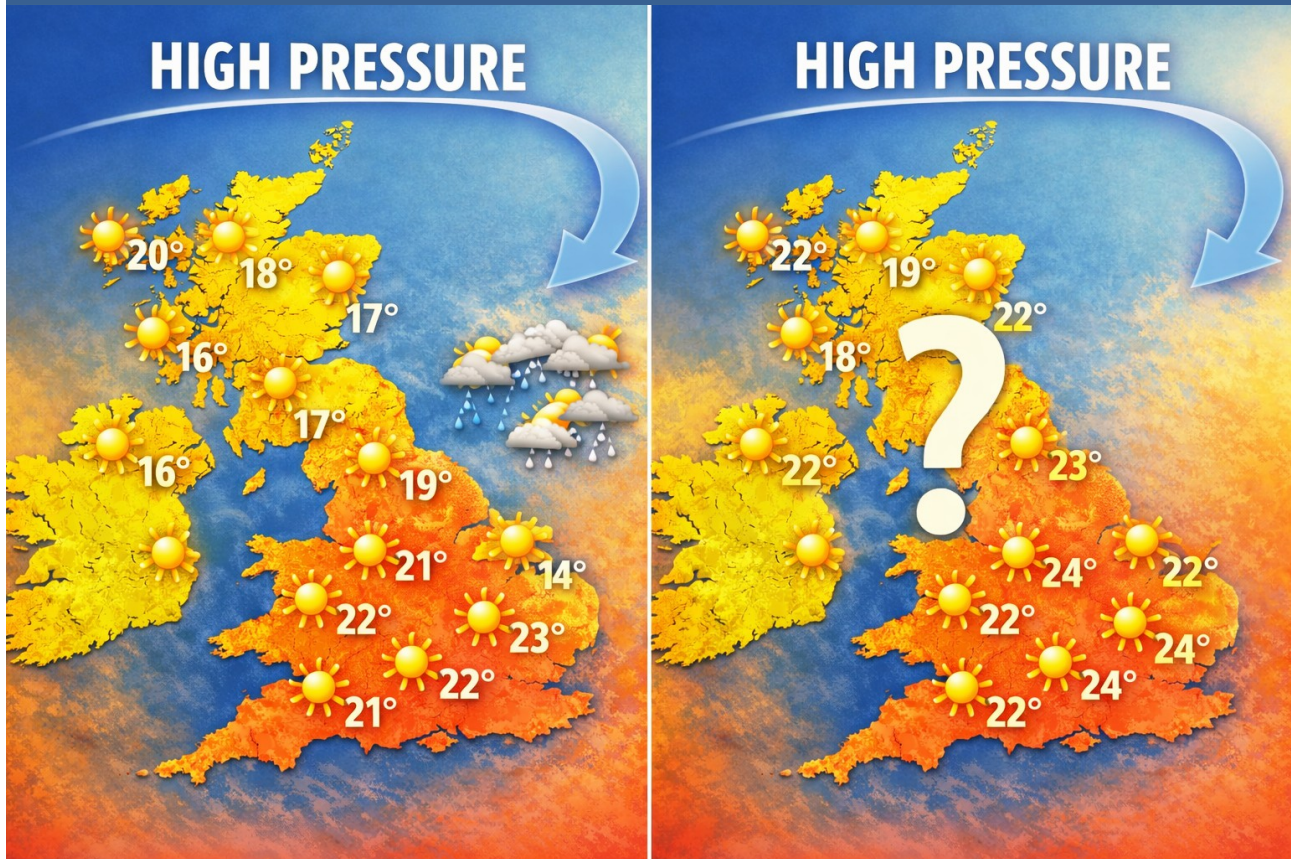

High Pressure To Rule With Ample Sunshine & Calm Weather For All + Gradually Rising Temperatures & How Warm Could It Get & When...

High-pressure-dominated weather will begin to feature from Sunday and throughout the whole of next week in terms of much more settled and gradually warmer weather for all parts of the country, alongside some developing and ample sunshine and gradually rising temperatures as the week progresses and perfectly in line with our longer-range spring forecast projections for mid and late April and more recently in our repeated short to moderate range forecasting techniques.

Due to the overall situation and positioning of the high pressure to the north of us, the warmest and best periods of development and warm-feeling sunshine are likely to be in more parts to the north-west and west of the country for much of the week and also for parts of the south with temperatures ranging into the mid to high teens at the very least in these parts or possibly a little higher and then also in the high teens to low 20s later in the week for parts further south.

Initially and importantly, we will also see some cooler and breezy to even windy weather to begin the upcoming week across parts more to the east and some central regions because of the situ of the high pressure and this could induce some unfortunate cloudy weather and even rain showers in these parts at times during the first half of the week.

However, this overall theme will improve in these parts and for many elsewhere as the upcoming week progresses, and we will see a gradual bettering of conditions in terms of less cloud and showers and much more in the way of some glorious mid-Spring and welcomed sunshine and further rising temperatures in at least the low 20s in the warmest spots and possibly even warmer in the days following on from later next week and to start the week of the 27th April.

Additionally, when the skies become clearer later in the week, there will be an increasing risk of some cool to cold nights and even fog and frosts, particularly in some rural parts of the country and before quickly being burnt away by the strong mid-spring sunshine.

To summarise, a fairly settled week for all with gradually rising temperatures and gradually decreasing cloud cover from the east to bring warm and prolonged sunny spells for many parts of the country, but particularly more so in parts of the north and west, north-west, and to the south of the country.

Additionally, part of our forecast and also this forecast expects even more significant high pressure rises to continue into late April and/or around the week starting 27th April or possibly a little earlier, and the situation of these next expected high pressure rises will be more favourable to bring and create some even warmer to potentially hot temperatures across our shores for the end of April and in at least the mid to high 20s over a 1-3 days or more minimum duration.
