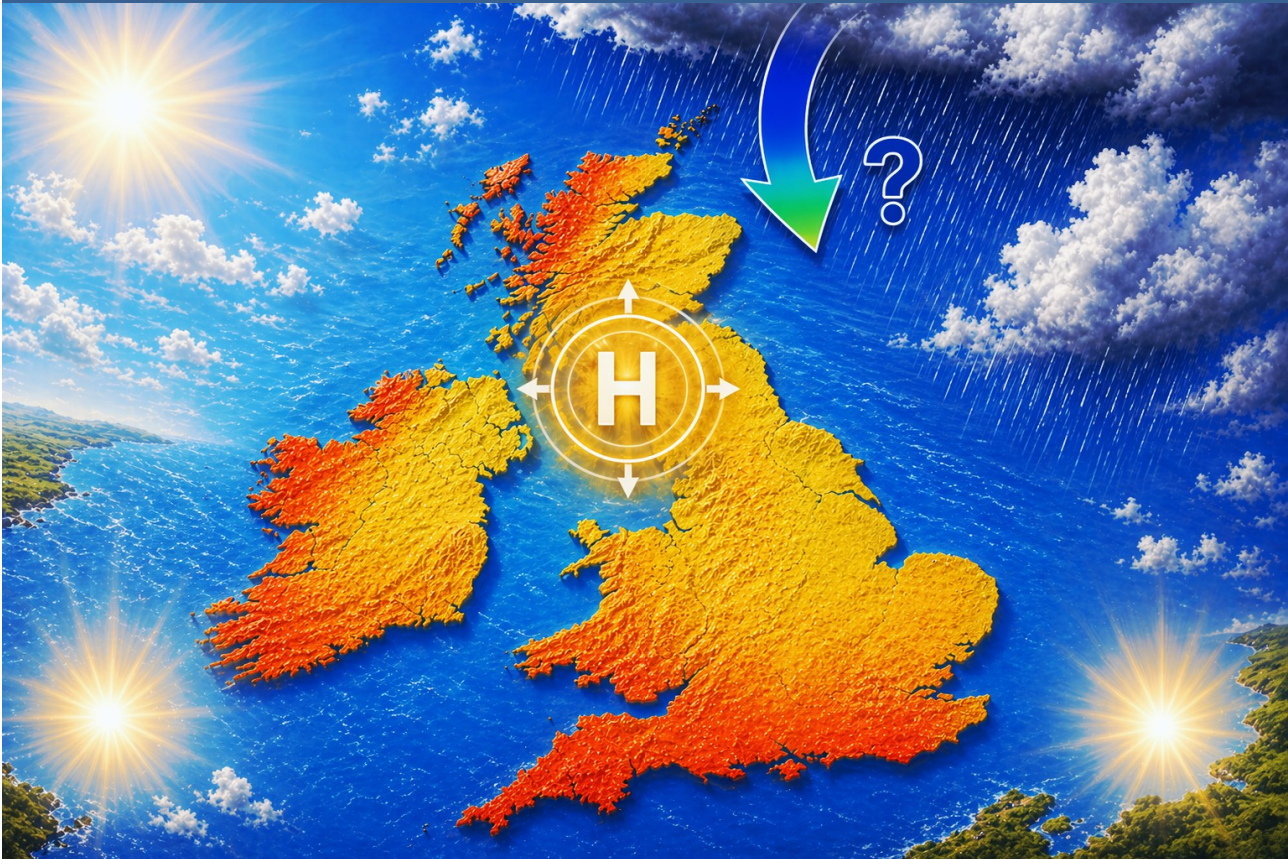

High-Pressure & Warm To Warmer Weather Remain In Charge + Should We Expect Any Changes Later & When...?

The upcoming week will initially remain high pressure dominated, with further sunny and dry weather conditions continuing for many parts of the country, despite some potential and gradually clouding over and cloudier conditions and potential showers being induced in places to start the upcoming week and after some earlier sunny spells to begin with on Monday.

The high pressure dominance will then continue with it being centred across parts of the south, west and north of the country for around Tuesday and Wednesday of next week, and this is when we could see some much warmer temperature values being recorded on the current days above in these localities, as the now strong spring sunshine begins to strengthen and register some quite warm temperature values towards or near the mid 20s that could also extend into and around Thursday and Friday before the strength of this high pressure cell begins to loosen its presence across our shores.

Unfortunately, some parts of the far north and east and some coastal regions in these parts could also be prone to extra cloud cover or cloudiness or even some sharp and sporadic showers at times during this upcoming week, whilst many others continue with the drier and sunny and even warm weather theme for April and for much of the working week.

However, towards the end of the working week (Friday/Saturday) and the next upcoming weekend and the start of May, we will begin to see a more southerly induced run of the jet-stream and low pressure interference coming into play across our shores and on some of the most current and main third-party computer model outputs.

Additionally, this could further induce some cooler and more unsettled and changeable weather conditions in the northern half of the country, whilst the southern half of the country stays more relatively sunny and settled.

However, high pressure will more likely once again be the more dominant force across our shores here and the worst-case scenario could see some brief to moderate spells of unsettled weather and cooler temperatures interfering with the north at the start of next weekend and, if anything, the more unsettled weather conditions and if at all could also be interlaced with at least some sunshine or even warm sunny spells away from the southern half of the country.

Additionally, the best case and more likely scenario will see high pressure receding slightly and also adjusting somewhat towards the start of next weekend to induce some interference from the north that should be quickly rebuffed by further high pressure rises across our shores and until around a particular date in early May when it is likely to turn considerably cooler and more unsettled for many over a certain time-period (exact and expected dates covered in Spring/May reports plus in further details below).

To conclude, the upcoming week will remain rather settled and sunny for many away from those far northern and eastern areas and also later on Monday, for many with some temporary increased cloud and possible showers, and some of the warmest spots in parts of the south and south-west, and to the north and west of country could see temperatures approaching or exceeding the mid 20s by midweek and Wednesday and possibly on either day sandwiching the same period (Tuesday and Thursday).

Additionally, further high-pressure-dominated or settled weather will be likely to continue as the key weather feature until we receive a bout of rather unsettled weather conditions from our own expectations filtering in across our shores for many for in and around May 5-7 and prior to further spells of warmth for certain expected periods during May (refer to May/Spring reports).
