WARM SUNSHINE TO STORMY & THUNDERSTORMS BY MIDWEEK

British Isles late August forecast

SUNDAY-MONDAY

Warm/hot late summer sunshine, widely low mid-high 20s

TUESDAY

Warm with showers and thunderstorms may become prominent far south, SW England, England Wales, Ireland

WEDNESDAY-SATURDAY

Low pressure takes over, heavy showers, potent thunderstorms, gusty wisty winds, flooding risk

LATE WEEKEND

Unsettled conditions easing and becoming drier and sunny from the south



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On-Cue Warm & Settled Weather To Give Way To On-Cue Unsettled & Stormy Conditions/Thunderstorms By Tuesday/Midweek...

The upcoming new week will begin where the weekend left off with further sunshine and warmth in development for many parts of the country, and despite hotter temperature values in the mid to high 20s on Sunday, Monday and into midweek or around Wednesday will also register temperatures not far from the low to mid to even high 20s quite widely in this duration (warm/hot for late August/Summer).

Additionally, beyond the weekend and Sunday will therefore actually see it becoming even warmer for those further north and on a more widespread scale than the weekend in terms of maximum temperatures for those being away from the south for some late summer sunshine and heat in the form of warm to hot daytime temperatures (low to mid 20s at least) whilst also fulfilling our original estimation in numerous updates in recent weeks for an overall lifespan of around 3-5 days for the high pressure influenced weather for within these exact dates (when it wasn't even on the radars of others) with the possibility of some muggy/cloudy conditions in amongst some "very sporadic" showery activity.

However, some of this more showery activity and thunderstorms could become more prominent across parts of the far south of the country during the early hours of Tuesday morning and also into parts of south-west England, Wales and Ireland within this same period and, whilst also potentially extending a little further north at times and also

possibly inducing some of those cloudier and even muggy feeling conditions we have also been reporting upon.

Unsettled weather and low pressure will then take over proceedings as the main feature from in and around midweek and Wednesday of next week and this will grace us with bands of heavy showers and widespread developing thunderstorms or more potent thunderstorms than of late and gusty winds working northwards for many during Wednesday through to around Saturday and whilst presenting us with further and high-risk flooding potential once again from rapid rainfall amounts in some very short time periods on some very dry ground.

Additionally, these unsettled and stormy conditions will also be accompanied by some gradually cooler temperatures and even quite windy conditions for late summer as the week progresses and as covered in our several months ahead forecast for summer (from Feb 2026) and repeated forecasts of recent weeks for these exact dates in August for more potent stormy weather and thunderstorms once again to round off summer.

However, there is some credibility in the unsettled and stormy weather working northwards somewhat by the weekend or around mid-weekend and leaving sunny spells and more settled weather in its wake...
