



Mixed With High Pressure Ridging/Heat On Certain Days + Significantly & Gradually Cooler/More Autumnal + Next High Pressure/Heat Dates...

Well, we have certainly seen the expected thunderstorm and flooding scenarios in recent days to end the record-breaking summer of heat this year on a low point and as accurately depicted within our long-range forecast for these exact dates from as early as February and repeatedly recently for the same dates/period.

Unfortunately, conditions will remain mixed heading into much of the upcoming week with further heavy showers and/or thundery developments still in the forecast but with more in the way of sunshine, particularly between showers.

Additionally, some very brief ridges of high pressure will also affect the weather during the next week to bring some drier and warm/hot to muggy-feeling conditions, particularly across the southern half of the country on and around Tuesday and with something more intense in terms of heat and humidity for in and around Thursday and making it feel humid and/or muggy/close-feeling for most and on a more widespread scale than earlier in the week but also more prominent and possibly longer influencing across parts of the south and east of the country at times and also at times going forward during later next week.

Unfortunately, it will be more than likely to remain mixed for many and parts of the north, in particular going forward from around and beyond Thursday of next week and prior to turning gradually and significantly cooler and much more unsettled from the north, whilst also spreading much further southwards across the whole country as very autumnal and/or stormy weather that is not too far away from our original several weeks ahead seasonal forecast for the start to autumn and September and in around these same start dates of around September 4-6 for these expected developments.

However, these exact same forecast indicators on our part also highlighted another minimum 2-3-day period of high pressure rises and rising temperatures across our shores for and around September 12-16 and this is something that both the GFS and ECM computer models are starting to toy with for around these same dates and for beyond them significantly cooler and much more unsettled conditions for all during early September and into the week beyond next week.

It would also be fair and sensible to assume a nightmare scenario and ever-changing forecasts with NO reliability from elsewhere during this upcoming topsy-turvy period...

Additionally, and to conclude for now, the hottest summer on record should also be declared elsewhere anytime soon and on our part and for CAUSALITY, providing they don't fudge the data or come up with another suitable for them "EQUAL ON RECORD" and to take away from the fact that they never had the ability to forecast such weather events for heat once again and despite all their global warming hype and drivel (solar-driven patterns and nothing to do with CO2).
