Continuing Hot Into A Second Week + Potentially Unusually HOT/HOTTEST In The North + Cooler & Thundery Later In The Week Or More Heat...

On Friday the 10th July, we experienced our second day of temperatures reaching and/or exceeding the mid 30s in places and today was the 6th day of temperatures over 31-33°C and also matched our repeated forecasts for "a big July heatwave for ALL parts of the country for in and around the start date of July 10th."

Additionally, these same long-range updates on our part also detailed and promised a "prolonged heatwave over weeks" and as we continue into a second week of hot temperatures across our shores, it will also bring this part of our forecast to fruition, despite some very different forecasts on overall temperatures and much shorter durations from elsewhere only recently and over the past several days alone.

So, into next week and around the middle part of next week, we will now be remaining hot for many parts of the country as the heatwave extends into a second week and just as our earlier updates indicated over the past several days when many others and the main third-party computer models had it at a much shorter duration overall.

Additionally, it could also become unusually hot to very hot and even hottest around midweek across parts of the north and Scotland due to the overall situation of the high-pressure in these parts on those dates, and temperatures in excess of around 30-35°C on the actual days of around midweek and Wednesday would not be out of the question in these parts if things develop as expected and on current high-pressure indicators from elsewhere such as the GFS and ECM computer models.

Unfortunately or fortunately (heat or non-heat camps), there are some good and strong indicators that things could turn somewhat fresher than the current oppressive heat with thunderstorms developing for many by around next weekend.

However, there are some quite big question marks surrounding whether there will be a temporary run of fresher weather and thunderstorms 'over days' during this period or 'over several days or more' instead and with conflicting signals on this from both the GFS and ECM computer model runs at present, and also with the GFS having the high-pressure and heat returning quite quickly and still wanting to push in across our shores from as early as later next weekend and after some temporary interruptions over days only.

Additionally, we moderately to strongly favour the latter of the two situations above on the more recent runs, but also think they could meet somewhere in between both of the projections above at times for beyond next weekend and for more into 'late July', particularly the further north you are and hence their current discrepancies on this (GFS/ECM).

With a warm August after the expected June and July heat, there is also no reason why we won't record the hottest summer on record for the second year on the bounce this year as of now...
