Continuing Warm & Largely Dry + Rain/Thunderstorm Possibilities Later In The Week For The Heat & Hot Weather To Return Afterwards...

High pressure will continue to keep most parts of the country warm and largely dry with sunshine and temperatures registering in the mid to high 20s throughout today (Sunday).

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Beyond this and up until around midweek, we will also see the high pressure intensifying from the west and keeping most parts of the country under dry, warm/hot and sunny weather conditions to begin the week and up until around Thursday or Friday before it begins to dissipate and give way to those cooler and more unsettled weather conditions and our first real rain possibilities in some time and the ever-increasing risk for some widespread thunderstorm activity as this expected breakdown of conditions 'over 2-3 days' at the very least begins to occur around next weekend and as covered in our last detailed update on this exact scenario prior to the weekend below.

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However, some very sporadic and brief showers could pop up in some far southern areas from as early as today and with more in the way of increasing cloud cover and potential hit-and-miss showery conditions or thundery rumbles developing in some parts of the far north and west from around midweek and with the high pressure feature and strong mid-summer sunshine being likely to burn away any earlier in the day cloud issues or

showery activity in these parts until later in the week (third-party weather apps probably overweighting cloud cover projections for parts further north and west earlier in the week as explained above).

Additionally, the temperatures are also likely to be higher than current app projections as we head into the upcoming week and on the actual day and there is NO reason why we won't see top temperatures hitting the low 30s at least in parts of the south and with some much warmer to hotter values developing elsewhere for most of the upcoming working week (Mon-Fri) and prior to those expected changes on our part.

However, these expected changes around next weekend are expected to be short-lived over days as high pressure and rising temperatures start returning across our shores once again as major heat and hot weather during the final days of July and to begin August (also ALL as covered in our last and multiple public updates on this below and also has backing from the GFS/ECM computer models).

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PS: Confusion from others towards recent and upcoming weather events is their problem and not mine, and those who choose to follow them and what they say, when we (myself/Exacta) have been or likely will be more accurate on this (separates the wheat from the chaff, I suppose)...
