## Major High Pressure & Warm/Hot Weather Set To Return On Cue Once Again Next Week & Beyond Explained...

From around late next week and for in and around Thursday or Friday and into next weekend and beyond, we will start to see high pressure rise influencing the weather across our shores once again, and despite what the current and main weather apps are presently showing from elsewhere for this same period and into the remainder of June at present, for which we are likely to see and feel the impacts of some significantly intensified temperature hikes from a pattern change to high pressure dominated weather but with variation in terms of overall intensity.

The GFS and ECM are still varied on this and the overall maximum temperatures at present, but what they do clearly show in the longer term is more major high pressure influenced weather near or very close to our expected dates of occurrence for and around June 9-11, before turning hotter again for an unchanged date of even 'higher confidence' for around June 22-24 and from our several months and weeks ahead projection and whilst staying largely high pressure dominated with variation from mild/warm and settled to hot periods (also covered and depicted with date illustrations for these exact dates within one of our last updates on this recently in the below).

However, at the peak of these major high pressure expectations over several days from in and around next Thursday/Friday and early next week could once again bring temperatures in the low

to mid 30s in the hottest parts of the country and with elsewhere across large parts of the UK and Ireland also turning very warm to very hot in this same period.

Also, do not be entirely surprised to see even hotter temperatures being incorporated at times from later next week and into the following week and throughout the remainder of June from elsewhere and, prior to that, and the even bigger and more prolonged heatwave we are expecting 'over weeks' for certain dates in July.

Additionally, and once again, unchanged reports from several months ahead have remained tight on our part, because of an unsettled and mixed start to summer this year and June, and even when many others were forecasting a high-pressure-dominated period for the 'whole month of June' only recently (see publicly dated links below).

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However, in the meantime, further cool, unsettled, and showery weather and thunderstorms with heavier pockets of rain will continue to impact many parts of the country for now and until around Thursday at the latest and although slightly longer than originally anticipated on our part over 'days', it is also well within standard deviation of a day or two to be allowed for weather forecasting and many others who 'always' apply such techniques on their part (not something that we often do ourselves).

Regardless of this, the high pressure rises and heat are returning for when we said once again...

All the following were forecast several weeks ahead in our unchanged subscriber's seasonal reports and then repeatedly in the run-up to each weather event for the exact dates:

Mid to late April heat ✓  
Late May heat ✓  
Early June/Summer cool/unsettled ✓  
Pending June heat ✓
