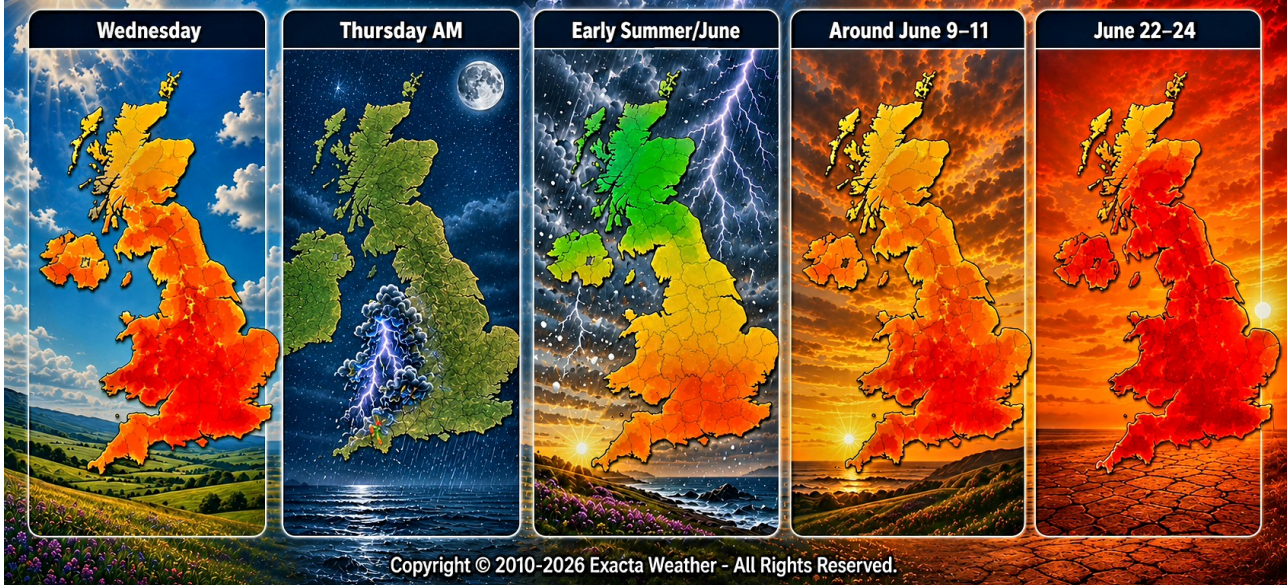

Staying Warm/Hot + Very Hit & Miss Thunderstorms + Expected Changes Later & The Next Heat Dates...



Staying Warm/Hot + Very Hit & Miss Thunderstorms + Expected Changes Later + The Next Heat Dates Revealed...

The weather will continue to be warm and still rather hot for some large parts of England during the remainder of the working week as the high pressure influence initially hangs on for now.

However, as there are often during such peaks of very warm to very hot periods of weather and any extensive periods of heat across our shores, we could very well begin to see some bubbling up but quite hit-and-miss thunderstorms from in and around the early hours of Thursday morning in some certain parts of the country 'only'.

Additionally, these are more likely to be restricted to certain parts of Wales and some limited parts of south-west England during the very early hours of Thursday and possibly to some limited parts of north-west England and/or Cheshire as short sharp showers later in the morning on Thursday.

However, some of these showers or thundery developments could incur some quite heavy rainfall amounts in short time periods and bring some flooding or flash-flooding possibilities to parts of Wales during early Thursday and potentially to some certain parts of south-west England, and with elsewhere and 'large' parts of the country left wondering what all the fuss is about.

Additionally, several of our private and then later public updates below (please check them below) have ALL clearly and repeatedly alluded to high pressure remaining largely in charge until AROUND THURSDAY or FRIDAY of this particular week and prior to some expected changes on our part to cooler and more unsettled conditions and more

widespread thundery downpours for elsewhere from various fronts and low pressure features during and around the upcoming weekend (from around Sunday) and to start the next upcoming week/June.

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However, and importantly, they also repeatedly covered a north and south divide potential for next week but with somewhat cooler temperatures than of late and thunderstorms also extending into parts of the south during this same period (please check again above).

This also now looks like being the expected and formed scenario on our part to start breaking down our current settled and warm/hot weather pattern from on and around Sunday of this week and also into next week, and further enhanced details will follow up on this and next week's weather later in the week privately and then also later again and/or in less detail publicly.
