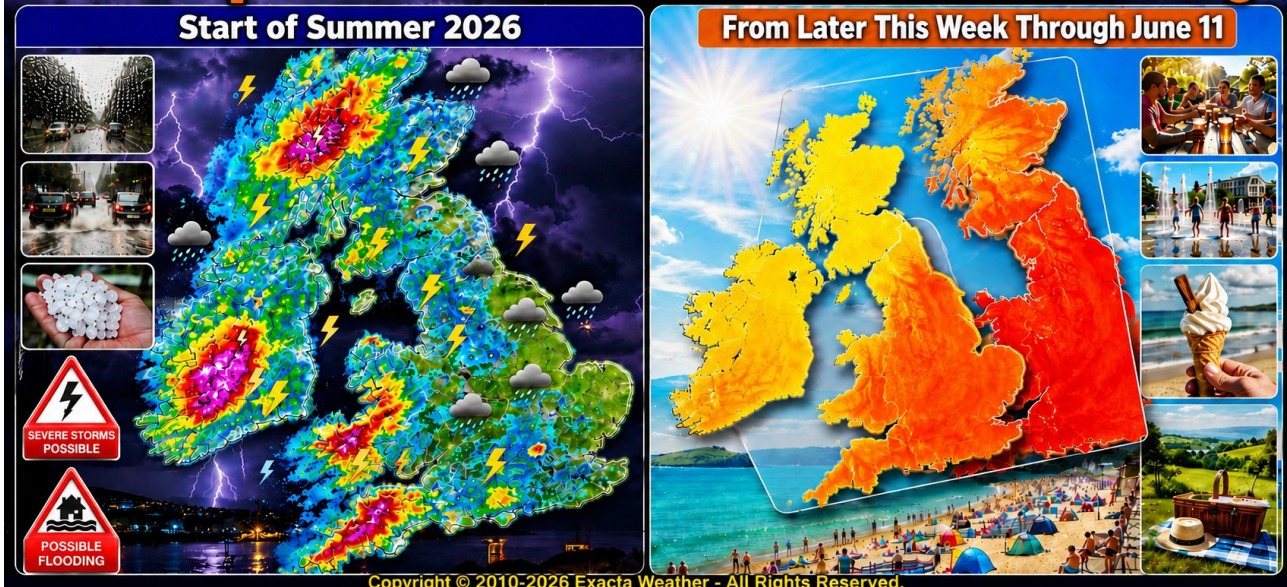

Becoming More Unsettled With Widespread Thunderstorms & For How Long



Becoming Expectantly More Unsettled With Widespread Thunderstorms & For How Long...

The prolonged run of settled and continuing warm to hot weather on our part in recent weeks is now coming to an end and the first of the unsettled conditions, heavy showers and thundery downpours will begin to impact parts of the far north and Scotland during Sunday afternoon and evening, particularly in parts to the east of Scotland and all as covered in our last public update from earlier in the week below for this exact day and date (Sunday) for more widespread changes to cooler and more unsettled weather conditions with thunderstorms for many from numerous and expected low pressure features and/or weather fronts during this next upcoming week and to begin summer 2026.

Additionally, these heavy showers will continue and even increase to some widespread thundery rumbles for many from around early Monday in western parts and then into much of Tuesday for elsewhere, and some of these could turn into much heavier pockets of thundery heavy downpours as they enhance in their overall nature in parts of the north and Scotland, the west of the UK, south-west England, Wales and also Ireland on Tuesday day and around early Wednesday (possibly some central regions too).

This potentially offers up some flash-flooding possibilities in some of these most prone parts to heavy rainfall amounts from these thunderstorms in some quite short time periods, and also with some unusually breezy to even windy weather and hail showers being induced and felt across our shores during the first few days of summer during next week.

Further mixed conditions will then be likely to continue throughout Thursday and into Friday but with more in the way of developing sunshine and sunny periods as conditions begin to improve, particularly from across parts of the south as we move into next weekend and as high pressure looks set to return and settle things down and start warming things up for many once again.

This is also likely to pave the way for additional and even 'more intense' and hotter weather producing high pressure build beyond this and for in and around our expected and earlier given out dates of around "June 9-11".

However, and quite importantly, we (myself/Exacta) can't completely rule out some further briefly unsettled weather or another temporary dip for a day or two, particularly across the north between the improvements and high pressure rises of around the next weekend and prior to our further expected dates of around "June 9-11".

Additionally, all of the above also matches our several-months ahead projections for these dates and to start summer this way and despite the correctly expected prolonged high pressure and major temperature rises of recent weeks, within the exact same and unchanged report from February 2026 on our part.
