Day 3 Apr. 16 Dublin to Killarney via Kilkenny Medieval City

Kilkenny's rich medieval heritage is evident in the city's treasure trove of historical buildings and landmarks, exemplified by the magnificent Kilkenny Castle. Kilkenny is arguably the pre-eminent medieval city in Ireland, with the current layout of the city clearly grounded in the city's medieval roots. However, the city's origins predate the medieval landmarks existing today. **BL**

Day 4 Apr. 17 The Gap of Dunloe Tour in Killarney on boats and jaunting carts



This tour is more of an adventure than tour. Combination of a bus to Kate Kearney's Cottage, then a journey of 7 miles/11.2 km ahead of you to be taken by jaunting car through the famous gap, a glaciated valley to Lord Brandon's Cottage, where snacks are available. Barbecues are arranged for Groups. After lunch the traditional style boat takes you through the three Lakes of Killarney to Ross Castle where a bus will return you to Killarney. **BL**

Day 5 Apr. 18 Killarney to Galway via The Cliffs of Moher and the Wild Atlantic Way

The Cliffs of Moher in County Clare are Ireland's most visited natural attraction with a magical vista that captures the hearts of one million visitors every year and are a Signature Discovery Point in the heart of the Wild Atlantic Way. They stretch for 8km (5miles), as the crow flies, along the Atlantic coast of County Clare in the west of Ireland and reach 214m (702 feet) at their highest point at Knockardakin just north of O'Brien's Tower. Here you can have a world class in a million-visitor experience. **Farewell Dinner in Kai Restaurant and Irish Music and Dance at Trad on the Prom.** Performers who have captivated audiences in extraordinary and groundbreaking productions such as 'Riverdance', 'The Chieftain s' and 'Lord of the Dance' have gathered together on ONE STAGE to present an unforgettable entertainment experience. **BLD**

Day 6 Apr 19 Free time in Galway before departures to Dublin International Airport

Day 6+ Apr 19 ABERDEEN to INVERNESS - Meet & greet by Guide at Aberdeen Airport and continue in executive coach towards Inverness, with touring through some of Scotland's highland regions enroute. Guests will travel via Speyside, a region renowned for some of Scotland's most famous whisky distilleries (such as Glenfiddich), with free time in **Craigellachie** and lunch (depending on flight timings), with its historic bridge, then on to **Elgin**. Here guest may choose to visit Johnson's of Elgin for cashmere shopping and a bit of history of wool garment making (it's a working mill still) or visit the ruins of Elgin cathedral. Transport and check-in to our hotel – Welcome dinner **D**

Aside from its pool and fitness club, it also has a wide range of banqueting rooms. Day 7 Apr 20 Loch Ness



A day tour in a private executive coach with guide will commence from the hotel and bring the group to the shores of beautiful Loch Ness. Guests will get a sense of the immense surroundings and a very special perspective during a **cruise** on one of the modern boats on this world-renowned Loch. Loch Ness is the largest lake in the British islands with a stunning depth of 227 m - plenty of space to hide a monster! Also included within the day-trip will be a visit to the ruins of Loch Ness's famous **Urquhart Castle**. On the return to Inverness there will be some free-time for guests to explore at leisure. **B**

Day 8 Apr 21 Inverness to Edinburgh

Check out of their hotel and be met by their guide in the morning for a full-day itinerary in a private executive coach, for their journey to Edinburgh. The tour will bring the group down through parts of the picturesque Cairngorm National Park before a pit-stop for a visit of **BLAIR CASTLE** near Pitlochry. This baronial castle dates back 750 years and has been home to the Atholl family spanning 7 centuries. The journey will continue to Dunkeld for some time at leisure for lunch and to explore this charming town, with its little shops, riverside pub and walk and cathedral ruins. Day 9 Apr 22 Edinburgh

Day 10 Apr 23 Beyond Edinburgh

ST. Andrews - with Falkland, more or less between Edinburgh and St Andrews, Falkland is a charming Scottish town/village, which some may recognize from early episodes of the OUTLANDER series. The town is primarily known for its 16th century Royal Palace, which was built as a country retreat and reputedly a favorite of Mary Queen of Scots and the tour will incorporate a visit to the Palace. During the journey from Edinburgh the guide will elaborate on the history and significance of the town, and guests will then have the opportunity to have lunch and explore at leisure. **Farewell Dinner:** Spirit of Scotland - Scottish Show experience at the Royal College of Surgeons (public show, to include dinner, one drink and Scottish-themed entertainment with live music and dancers). **BD**

Day 11 Apr 24 Overnight in Edinburgh

Breakfast in hotel, leisure time in Edinburgh, and departure on our pm flight for home. **B**
