Letters were solicited from residents concerned with the traffic on our streets and noise created by the remodeling. These are issues affecting our lifestyles and quiet enjoyment of our properties.

Petition for Changing the City Council Meeting Time:

Recently, a piece in the Desert Sun by Susie Harvey has taken issue with the time the City Council meets. They meet at 1:00 PM in the afternoon. There are residents who feel it is more appropriate to meet when more citizens are available which would be in the early evening – 5 PM or later. Rancho Mirage is the only city in the Valley that has an afternoon meeting schedule. A petition is available, if you feel this is a good idea.
