Artist Bio

Reggie Singleton was born and raised in Detroit, Michigan. Singleton began drawing at an early age and majored in Fine Arts at Wayne State University from 1999 - 2002. His major influences are Alphonse Legros, Frank Stella, and Mark Rothko. Early on Singleton's primary mediums were Inks and Acrylics until the late great Charles McGee encouraged him to pursue Wood Sculpture in 2010. Singleton's primary focus has been this medium since then and through his framed wood reliefs, Singleton developed a technique known as "Surongajii". In 2017, this biomorphic technique earned Singleton a permanent installation in Wayne State University's Bioengineering Building. Through his art, Singleton continues to push boundaries of form, color, and composition.
