Examples include writing on the different steps, the principles, gratitude, etc. Jars are 1 recyclable PET plastic with a black screwtop lid. Perfect for carrying with you!

## Sponsorship – One of Our Tools of Recovery

Why be a sponsor or Why you need to have a sponsor – through the lens of *The Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Overeaters Anonymous*, Second Edition.

**Step 4** – Spiritual Principle: Courage. "We have found it best to approach this inventory with the words "fearless" and "searching" uppermost in our minds. Many of us become experts of self-deception after years of lying to ourselves about how much we have been eating and the problems our eating behaviors have caused us physically, emotionally, and spiritually. We've lied to ourselves about our other problems, too, denying that we've made mistakes, that we've been wrong about things, that we need to change. We *must* change if we are to recover. Change begins with honesty." **Your Sponsor can help you with ways to approach your inventory.** 

**Step 5** – Spiritual Principle: Integrity. The definition of integrity is the quality of being honest, demonstrating reliability and trustworthiness. Taking responsibility and accountability for your actions, good and bad. In Step 5, "Admitting the exact nature of our wrongs to another person can be a frightening prospect, for we've never before risked such complete openness. Yet, we find that we haven't really admitted the full truth to ourselves until we speak about it with someone else. ... It is important to choose a trustworthy and understanding person with whom to complete Step Five." **Sponsors are the main people to connect with to do this, since they have taken us through the first four steps.** 

**Step 6** – Spiritual Principle: Willingness. Definitions of willingness include the quality of being happy to do something that is needed, readiness and eagerness, and take initiative. "We are powerless over each of our defects of character, just as we are powerless over the food. Our character defects need to be removed by a Power greater than ourselves; we cannot do it alone. ... Being "entirely ready" means that we firmly turn our backs on the old self-destructive behaviors and make every effort to live by the Principles embodied in the Twelve Steps." If we become discouraged our sponsors can be utilized for support. We have willingness for continued growth and change. **Sponsors are a great resource to support your efforts.**

# Step 12: What I Feared I'd Never Have

**Step 12:** Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to compulsive overeaters and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

Having had a spiritual awakening...

I remember thinking that as an atheist I would never have one, but I have...

The first time I realized it was In the 1980's when a fellow OAer said she realized that the sun was still coming up in the morning even though she was no longer pulling on the rope! Me, too! I thought.

I realized that the universe was running fine without me telling my family and friends how to live. I was not the center. My input was not essential...and I was happy with that.

Another spiritual awakening came when I realized my black and white thinking was gone, and acceptance had replaced it. There were thousands of spiritual systems in the world and that meant we all have spiritual needs and we can find what we need, not have to follow someone else's path. So I get to be an atheist with a spiritual life that works for me. Other people get to believe in the God of their understanding.

another moment was when in the middle of a posh restaurant, i realized that I didn't care what I ate! Food was not my life anymore... The hidden promises had come true.

Reading Acceptance is the Answer in the Big Book, (which was called Doctor, Alcoholic, Addict when I first read it in the third edition), also woke me up to actual acceptance of other people as they are. I had thought I was accepting them when I didn't criticize out loud even though I knew they were wrong. That reading helped me understand that quiet disapproval was not acceptance and that other people are not me, don't think like me, and need to do things in the way that helps them and works for them. My way is my way and their way is theirs.

Practicing these principles in all my affairs can be harder. I seem to recycle old patterns. After all I was not in recovery till I was 45, so I had practiced compulsion to eat, be right, and correct everyone for 45 years. It took a while to learn new methods and new ideas. Still practicing!

When I am in harmony with reality, I am living my spiritual awakening. And I am happy for you to have found yours.

### Tradition Twelve: It's Not About Me, It's About Us

**Tradition 12:** Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all these Traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.

A wise person once explained that the steps of OA keep us from harming ourselves and the traditions keep us from harming each other. Tradition 12 is much, much more than simply not using our last name. This tradition cuts deep into the spiritual meat of our program – requiring humility and resulting in the realization that our recovery is delivered through our Higher Power.

In my experience with this tradition, I must accept others in OA. I'm not going to like everyone, or agree with everyone. Tradition 12 calls on me to tolerate my fellow OAer, and in the truest sense of fellowship, love them. Our



common bond of food addiction cuts through any of our petty differences and places us each on an equal footing on this broad highway. We set aside any conflicts and prioritize the need to help another suffering compulsive overeater.

Anonymity requires that we place spiritual principals before personalities. When we place principals before personalities, we place the welfare of OA and the group above our own selfish desires. At the core of these self-sacrificing attitudes is anonymity – so vital, it is the second half of our name. The Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Overeaters Anonymous reminds us that, "It is essential that all of us understand and respect anonymity if OA is to survive..."

From a practical perspective, anonymity is a vital element in the fabric of OA. This enables our members to have trust that they may share their feelings in a general way in our meetings without risk of judgement or gossip. For OAers, and newcomers especially, the OA rooms must provide a private haven for the safe disclosure of our food addiction struggles. As one of our OA sayings goes -- whom you see here, what you hear here, let it stay here...here, here!!

I've been reminded that anonymity is not a sign of shame or the same thing as secrecy. Our OA literature, The Tools of Recovery, says, "It is not a break of anonymity to use our full names within our group or OA service bodies." On the topic of service, anonymity reminds me to serve OA without any desire for recognition, prestige or power. This is difficult in a world of social media where we are constantly seeking that endorphin hit to our ego by getting "likes" and "shares." On the contrary, anonymity takes us out of self -- the more I think of you, the less I think of me.

Our humility will shine through when we find that we are content with the fact that we are just another bozo on the bus – just another compulsive overeater. No better, no worse than anyone else. When integrated into our lives, tradition 12 manifests itself as contentment to be one of a group and not seek prestige for our success in overcoming our food addiction. We grow in effectiveness in sharing the program with others while giving all credit for our recovery to our Higher Power.

I've been saved from my compulsive overeating by learning that it's not about me – it's about us.

### Twelfth-Step-Within Day

As you might expect, Twelfth-Step-Within Day is celebrated in December, the twelfth month. And oftentimes, there are special events on December 12 (it's okay to practice TSW work all month!). Twelfth-Step-Within Day was established by the World Service Business Conference of Overeaters Anonymous in 2009. Groups and Intergroups around the world are encouraged to plan events to support the still suffering compulsive eater within our fellowship. Here are some of the ideas that have been proposed over time. You can use any of them this year—maybe share them with your home group?—or save as possibilities for the future:

- 1. Members agree to make outreach calls on December 12th. (12 calls at 12 o'clock).
- 2. Intergroups publish a list of ideas in December that have been brainstormed at their business meeting to offer support to struggling members.
- Meetings or Intergroups make copies of the "Recovery Insurance Policy"
   (http://www.oa.org/pdfs/recoveryinspolicy2.pdf). On December 12th, encourage members to reach out to each other to make pacts to give each other extra support.
- 4. Members are encouraged to use December 12th as a day of reflection on the strength of their own recovery. They can write down 12 actions that will support their own or others recovery. Sharing their list with another member is encouraged.
- 5. In December, Intergroups make copies of the *Been Slipping and Sliding? A Reading and Writing Tool* questions. These are available for those who are struggling or want to strengthen their recovery. (http://www.oa.org/pdfs/been%20slipping%20and%20sliding.pdf)
- 6. In December, offer to drive someone to a meeting who hasn't been able to attend.
- 7. Write an article for December 12th to your intergroup newsletter or Lifeline. What support and encouragement can you offer to a member who is struggling in program?
- 8. Offer to babysit in December for a member to attend a meeting.
- 9. Call 12 members who no longer attend meetings.
- 10. Plan a reunion with past and present members for December... before "the eating season."
- 11. Conduct in-home meetings in December for shut-ins.
- 12. Call a sponsee who is struggling with the physical, emotional, or spiritual part(s) of recovery on December 12th. Offer honesty and support.




