



***The Lost Keys of Freemasonry-By Manly P. Hall
(Published in 1923, based off the 4th Revision 1931)***

In Chapter I, The Eternal Quest, we gain an understanding that Freemasonry, is a continuation of past schools, which taught many of the ideals that we are taught within the three degrees. Freemasonry is an Esoteric craft, which isn't based on our worldly ideals, but rather a spiritual essence that brings us closer to perfection and our divine creator. When we understand this, we begin to understand the importance of Freemasonry, and the underlying teachings it affords us on so many levels.

The teachings of Freemasonry are eternal, and no matter the time or era, the teachings are as relevant today, as they were when they were created. By taking the opportunity to examine the teachings within, we can understand how Freemasonry can guide us into becoming better men. By bettering ourselves, we are in turn bettering the world around us, and when we share the light we absorb with others, we are providing that spark of divinity so many are looking for, but only those with open eyes will see.

In Chapter II, The Candidate, the reader is taken on a journey, and one I had to read a couple of times better understand the conceptualization of Manly P. Hall's understanding the candidate's mind. My take on this chapter is that all Masons, prior to initiation have that urging within them, of something greater in life, and until that urge is acted upon, we feel as though we're living within a crypt, jail cell or a walled off room.

This doesn't have to be about Masons, and can be applied to anything you are searching for in life, but the fact that the chapter leads you up to the door, and leaves you at the knocks is an impressive and guttural feeling, having been through the first degree of Freemasonry.

I believe that all men are searching for something bigger than themselves, and this chapter attempts to have the reader realize that we should continue on our journeys forward, and never stop wanting. I believe all men are 'Willing' and 'Able' to succeed in life, but they have to be 'Willing' to take chances and 'Able' to stand strong and weather the storms, and that's what I have understood from this chapter.

Chapter III, The Entered Apprentice, should be read a few times, due to the amount of information given. It is not new information, or something we haven't been privy to throughout our lives, but it should be read a few times so that it sinks in. We all understand that the Entered Apprentice is the 'Youth', and it is our foray into understanding and growth, no matter what our age or stage of life, is.

The author states that the first 'key' in Freemasonry is 'Service.' While most may read this think they need to go out and perform duties for everyone around them, understanding that nothing around you changes without make personal changes first. Treating yourself right, by eating right, dressing appropriately, exercising, being more spiritual, etc. . .helps condition the man as he matures into the more advanced degrees/ Service to yourself, so that you may better serve your fellow man is the first Lost Key of Freemasonry.

When we become an Entered Apprentice Mason, we are given our Rough Ashlar, so that we may polish and adorn it, as we begin to remove the vices and superfluities in life, that are not conducive to the teachings of Freemasonry. It is the job of every man to be personally responsible for their actions, their attitudes, and their work. Freemasonry, to me, embodies personal responsibility, and I believe the author summed that up perfectly in this chapter.

Chapter IV, The Fellow Craft, explains the pivotal moment in your Masonic development. Being advanced to the Fellow Craft Degree, the candidate takes on much more responsibility, both in life and in duties to the Craft. The candidate has now progressed from youth to manhood, and is the symbol of strength, as his spiritual world begins to unfold around him.

It is this advancement, and the knowledge that comes with it, that gives the candidate their second key, 'Emotion.' What does this mean to the candidate? Emotion, like any tool or object in our arsenal, can be used for the betterment or destruction of ourselves, and our fellow man. We must learn to quell the fiery angst within us, so that we are men of more stature. We must not allow the destruction of Emotional Energies to overtake us, but instead work towards self-mastery in all our doings.

In life, and especially these turbulent times, we can let our emotions escape us, or get caught up in others ill-emotional breakdowns, which can be likened to any of the three ruffians who took down Hiram Abiff. Personal Responsibility is taken to a new level for the candidate, and forces us to look inward, and make the necessary changes to be more upright in character.

It is the duty of a Fellow Craft to take that fire within us, and transmute it into light for others to see, for the keywords of this degree are, Poise, Compassion and Transmutation. According to the author, there are five requirements that a candidate must master in order to be considered a Fellow Craft.

1. Mastery of all emotional outbreaks
2. Master of animal energies (curbing passion and desire)
3. The Understanding and Mastery of the creative forces
4. The transformation of personal affection into impersonal compassion.
5. Understanding of the five senses to the study of human problems.

The Fellow Craft is now coming of age, and with that comes certain understanding of human nature, and the rules of a civilized man in accordance to the will of God. It is the responsibility of the candidate to study the Seven Liberal Arts, to understand how and when to speak, and to give comfort to his fellow man.

Chapter V, The Master Mason, completes the final degree of a Craft Mason, and in doing so, explains the duties and responsibilities of the newly raised Mason. Coming from Youth, through Manhood, and now into Old Age, the Master Mason is now a teacher, and no longer a student. Having labored in the quarries of life, he must now embody the human mind, as well as the spiritual understanding of a life coming to an end.

The Master Mason leaves the world of darkness behind him, and like the Rising Sun, radiates light in all directions, illuminating the lost, the unlearned, and student. For the Master Mason knows that this obligations are not limited to the inside of the lodge room, but should be felt within the Grand Architect's Lodge Room, walled off only by heaven's dome.

It is the Master's job to search for the lost word of the three Grand Masters, replacing the substitute given as a temporary means while our journey continues. The Lost word lives within us all, and can only be revealed when we look within ourselves.

The Master Mason never rests, and continues to work on his inner temple that house not made with hands, until he draws his last breath. He knows the riches that exist behind that blue veil above him, as he takes every opportunity to polish his ashlar. Beyond the rituals and degrees of the candidate, the true initiation is given when we enter the world for the first time as Master Masons, where we begin to work in the Lodge of the Great Architect, where human eyes are not upon us, but a power so great, we can never escape its gaze. This is where we are truly initiated and raised to be a sublime Master.

In Chapter VI, The Qualifications of a True Mason, we learn that Freemasonry is not just the lodge, or the Fraternity, but all of nature. We must respect The Great Architect's divine creations, and guard them with our lives, rather than fail in our duty to our obligations.

On becoming a Master Mason, you will learn that being a 'True Mason' isn't looking in the material world for pleasures but seeks to look inside to understand the spiritual unfoldment that appears in front of him, guiding his path in recognition of his speak of Spiritual Unity. This is what brings him closer to the Cosmic Lodge that we are all seeking to find within our hearts and souls.

The True Mason will respect other's beliefs and customs, knowing that the names for Deity are nothing compared to the understanding of the light behind the teachings. The heart of a Mason must stretch beyond the walls of his lodge so that he may understand the true nature of divinity. All paths lead to one, and it is that one, that we will find salvation.

This leads us to an important aspect of not only Freemasonry, but any Religion or Group that guards itself from the outside world. The words in our ritual, the grips and signs, all mean nothing to those on the outside, because it is the underlying meanings, allegories, and symbolism, that we are taught and devoted to living, that are important. The ignorant can only interpret it with bias, but a Mason will love it with integrity.

The world of Freemasonry is based on a mythological allegory, that help transmute the sould of lead into the house of gold. The underlying

premise of Freemasonry is that, like the operative quarrymen of old, we too must work to make our temple a unification of God and Man. We all must make this journey, while some will complete the task, many will not. We must battle the ruffians in our minds to succeed in raising our Grand Master each day through our actions, using the tools we are given during those first three steps. Freemasonry is not an idle fraternity, it is a working one, and only those who work will receive their wages.


