$\frac{RI.K.11.b}{L}$ Use the most frequently occurring inflections and affixes (e.g., -ed, -s, re-, un-, pre-, -ful, -less) as a clue to the meaning of an unknown word.
RI.K.12 With guidance and support from adults, explore word relationships and nuances in word meanings.
