# The End of an Era

**1894 - Lackawanna Iron & Steel paid \$2,729,640.50 (\$75,823,347.22) for Robert H. Coleman's 15 5/8 share of the Cornwall Ore Banks, furnaces and a controlling interest in the Cornwall & Lebanon Railroad**

**1901 - North Lebanon family interest in Cornwall Ore Banks sold to PA Steel for \$2,109,375 ( \$60,267,857.14) plus 6,906 shares of capital stock in Cornwall & Lebanon Railroad for \$219,265.50 (\$6,264,728.57); \$8,500,000 (\$242,857,142.86) for North Lebanon furnaces – Arthur Brock, being a director of PA Steel “perfected the deal”**

**1916 - BS Announced acquisition of PA Steel and MD Steel - \$31,960,800 (\$710,240,000.00)**

**1917 - AIS ready for dissolution of all stock transfer – total assets of \$10,836,686.69 (\$204,465,786.60)**

**1918 – Remaining furnaces and Ore Bank shares purchased by BS**
