A Question of Balance

A nation is the totality of the people living in a certain area. How the people are organized economically, socially, politically, religiously, etc. is what makes them a nation. Today our nation, the United States of America, is a divided nation. The nation is divided in a number of ways but I would like to discuss the political division in terms of conservatism and liberalism.

So much of the strife comes from the conservatives or traditionalists known as the Establishment, trying to hold sway over the future of the nation to the exclusion of the liberals or those advocating and embracing change. However, the same is true of liberals who see the Establishment as an anchor that is holding back and strangling progress. Both of these points of view, when seen as separate entities, is ignorance.

Any living or growing entity, be it plant, animal or social structure, such as a nation, requires a balance of both to sustain its health, growth and propagation. Take for example a tree. A tree cannot survive without the sustenance provided by the established growth. The established roots and branches draw nutrients and water from the earth and established leaves draw energy from the sun. The very life of the tree is dependent on that established growth.

The liberal, or change aspect of the tree is the process and development of new growth. The liberal element is the growing tip of the tree (or nation).
