You Cannot Be Under Law and Under Grace at the Same Time

GALATIANS
5:1-4
(KJV)

- 1 Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.
- 2 Behold, I Paul say unto you, that if ye be circumcised, Christ shall profit you nothing.
- 3 For I testify again to every man that is circumcised, that he is a debtor to do the whole law.
- 4 Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace.



UNDER THE LAW:

- Demands performance
- Produces condemnation
- Focuses on what you must do
- Leads to bondage and fear



UNDER GRACE:

- Provides what was done
- Produces acceptance
- Focuses on what Christ has done
- Leads to freedom and peace

ROMANS 14:23 (KJV)

"And he that doubteth is damned if he eat, because he eateth not of faith: for whatsoever is not of faith is sin."



THE PROBLEM OF SPLIT LOYALTY

Many professing Christians live two lives:

- They believe in grace for salvation.
- But they live under law for acceptance, identity, or security.

This creates confusion, guilt, pride, and spiritual bondage.

It is spiritual schizophrenia. You cannot mix law and grace. They are two different covenants with two different results.

Galatians 5:4 warns us:

"Christ is become of no effect unto you, whosoever of you are justified by the law; ye are fallen from grace."
