The President's Corner

My dad would not believe many of the things that are happening in our world today. North Korea threatening the United States with nuclear weapons?! It sounds laughable on the surface, but tyranny in any form is frightening. Especially in full color HD all day every day.

I am comforted in *knowing* Who is really in charge.

Dad fought in the Korean Conflict. He came home in 1953 after spending more than a year there. He told me that his unit was the first to be deployed with newly issued "insulated boots". He described soldiers heading home with obvious frost-bite injuries. The new insulated boots were heavy and awkward, as he described them. He and his buddies were very grateful to have this extra protection against Korea's biting cold. Uncle Sam's army was doing its best to take care of our soldiers.

Dad passed away in August of 2009, several weeks after his 80th birthday. In today's world, there are still many things that my dad would recognize, and embrace. The sparkle and giggles of his great-grandchildren; some that he met while he was here on earth, others who will have to wait for an introduction and reunion in Heaven. Dad would be amazed by the efficiency and scale of today's modern farmer. He may have scratched his head at the hi-tech, air-conditioned, computerized cockpit of today's tractors and self-propelled implements, but a little training, and he would have jumped right in.

So far, as I have been talking about "my dad", you immediately know that I am talking about my earthly, flesh-and-blood father, the one who lived with my mother for 56 years, and was there every day of my childhood. In today's world of blended families and non-traditional domestic situations, "Dad" may not be biological, but a true "Dad" is the one who is there for the children. He ties shoes, wipes away tears and cleans up skinned knees. He reads stories and plays games or watches football with the kids. He makes room in his heart when the kids come running to him, frightened by a thunderstorm "or things that go bump in the night".

As Christians, we are blessed to have a Father in Heaven, one who Jesus called "Abba". In Mark 14:36, Jesus is praying in the garden of Gethsemane. In this darkest hour, Jesus cried out. And he said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Remove this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will."

"Abba" is an Aramaic word that most closely translates as "Daddy". Jesus and Paul encourage us to call Him "Daddy", too. In Romans 8:15, it says "For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, (and daughters), by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!"

Abba! Daddy! We need your help! Gethsemane Lutheran Church needs you. Please be with us and keep us safe from all spiritual harm as we stretch and grow, finding the path you have for us, that will guide us to the perfect pastor that you have already selected for us. Amen.


