Tomorrow and Today

Call to me and I will answer you, and will tell you great and hidden things that you have not known. Jer 33:3

Parables. Jesus quotes Isaiah the Prophet by saying "I will open my mouth in parables; I will utter what has been hidden since the foundation of the world" (Matt 13:35). The disciples asked Jesus "Why do you speak to them in parables?" He answered them, "To you it has been given to know the secrets of the Kingdom of Heaven, but to them it has not been given" (Matt 13:10-11) otherwise "they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their heart and turn, and I would heal them" (Matt 13:15b) because "the message they heard did not benefit them, because they were not united by faith with those who listened" (Heb 4:2). So, we can say that parables were given to hide the meaning from those who choose to reject Jesus and the message of God and to clarify or give a fuller meaning and understanding to those who believed on the Lord.

It is the lesson of a parable that is important to us. The story is not important in itself; it may or may not have literally happened, but it is most certainly TRUE. Was there really a "Good Samaritan" who took pity on an injured Jew? It doesn't matter. The story demonstrates the truth about love, mercy, and forgiveness.

I heard a story a long time ago that has stuck with me. Pastor Robert led a small church in a rough part of town. He had grown up there, and he knew firsthand how rough it was. As a teenager, he had been a member of a gang, and had done some very bad things. He later realized that the best thing that ever happened to him was his time in prison. He became a Christian there and started working other inmates to show them the truth. He had a gift and a good heart. After he was released, Robert finished his training and became a pastor.

Robert understood love, mercy, and forgiveness, but he was troubled about his youth. While in the gang, he had done something so terrible, he didn't see how he could ever be forgiven. He prayed, but he simply couldn't forgive himself.

There was an older woman, Helen, a member of the congregation, who didn't get out much. Her friends who knew her well thought she was a little bit eccentric. She loved Pastor Robert's visits and he loved to visit her. They would talk for hours. She was so filled with Christian love and joy, Robert was able for a brief time to forget his troubles. Some people thought that she was a little more than eccentric, but perhaps a bit crazy. She said that Jesus would come to visit her at her home, where they would talk the time away. (As she said, "He would just pop in!). She was so sincere, she was so happy. Everything she said about His visits was so right. Robert was confused, but intrigued. Could this be?

One time when Helen was going on and on about Jesus' visit, Pastor Robert couldn't help himself. He asked a favor of Helen. "Of course, Pastor, anything" she answered. "The next time our Savior stops by, please ask him about the terrible thing I did when I was young." Helen paused, but said she would, and added that Jesus was so happy with his work for the Kingdom. But she promised to ask. A week passed and Robert went to see Helen. As usual, she was joyful and happy. After a while, Robert's curiosity was too much. "Did our Lord come by to see you?" "Why, yes Pastor, he was just here." "Well? Did you ask him? What did he say??" "Pastor, when I asked, Jesus sat back in the chair and looked up at the sky. He thought for a minute, and then he said, 'Helen, I just don't remember'."

Did this story really happen? Probably not, but it is certainly true. That's the God we need. That's the Savior we have. We are forgiven.




This year is flying by! We are so close to the holidays. The school is doing well, we have enrolled several new students, and we are getting excited about our October events.


