First thing in the morning, we called Carla and asked her to spend more time with Neko— not just to give him food and water, but to give him the companionship he so desperately needed.

That helped a little, and got him (and me) through the week. But when we got home, Neko joyfully leapt into Lisa's arms. Everything was forgiven. Everything was OK. Everything was back to normal. It's like nothing ever happened.

J.R.R. Tolkien, the great British writer, said something that goes like this: *the birth, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ assures that, one day, everything sad will come untrue*. C.S. Lewis, in his book, *The Great Divorce*, wrote:

Call Committee

Greetings in the name of our risen Lord!

You may have heard by now that Pastor Eden has returned our Call. This does not mean that he has rejected our congregation! It means that he prayerfully struggled with the decision to serve the Lord in Sulphur Springs or in Houston. He was led by the Holy Spirit to continue his ministry in Sulphur Springs.

This does not mean that we have failed – as a committee or as a congregation. This is part of the Divine Call process. The emphasis is entirely on the Spirit – not on us.

The next step in the call process is to submit new nominations for a pastoral candidate to the Texas District. The district president's office will determine if the nominee can receive a call at the present time. The names of suitable candidates will be combined with other candidates from the entire LCMS, and the list will be returned to our committee. We will prayerfully review all information available for the candidates, conduct interviews, and with your help, select one to Call. I will keep you informed every step of the way.

Beginning on Sunday April 15 through Sunday April 29, nomination forms will be available in the narthex and in the church office. If you don't see them, ask an elder or usher for one.

On the back of the nomination forms is a list of the requirements our congregation has for a pastor. Please review these requirements and prayerfully consider them when nominating a candidate. Please return completed forms by Monday, April 30.

Keep praying for our congregation, our committee, and our pastor-to-be. In due season, God will reveal.
