AS WE GATHER

God, through Paul, reminds us that Easter is of "first importance." If Christ had not arisen, our hope would be still locked in the tomb. Because He is risen, just as He said, we have hope of our own resurrection from the dead and look forward to the life everlasting, which death cannot touch. We come here today not simply to remember an event but to rejoice in the future made possible for us because of what happened.

(The Invocation and Litany are led from the back of the nave; the procession begins here and commences with the singing of the hymn.)
