Tomorrow and Today

Call to me and I will answer you, and will tell you great and hidden things that you have not known. Jer 33:3 "Houston. Tranquility Base here. The Eagle has landed." Neil Armstrong

Fifty years ago, July 20, 1969, two men from the crew of Apollo 11 landed on the moon. Some hours later, those two men walked on its surface. What a magnificent event! But, before those first steps on the moon, something else truly magnificent took place. The Lunar Module pilot, Edwin (Buzz) Aldrin celebrated the Sacrament of Holy Communion, on the moon.

In an interview published in *Guideposts* Magazine, he said: "So, during those first few hours on the moon, before the planned eating and rest periods I reached into my personal preference kit and pulled out the communion elements along with a 3x5 card on which I had written the words of Jesus: "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, will bear much fruit; for you can do nothing without me." (John 15:5). I poured a thimbleful of wine from a sealed plastic container, and waited for it to settle down as it swirled in the one-sixth Earth gravity of the moon. My comments to the world were inclusive: 'I would like to request a few moments of silence . . . and to invite each person listening in, wherever and whomever they may be, to pause for a moment and give thanks in his or her own way.' I silently read the Bible passage as I partook of the wafer and the wine, and offered a private prayer for the task at hand and the opportunity I had been given."

This is my body. This is my blood. Matthew 26:26 -28; Mark 14:22 - 24; Luke 22:19 -20; 1 Corinthians 11:24 - 26

Later, Aldrin also wrote: "I gave thanks for the intelligence and spirit that had brought two young pilots to the Sea of Tranquility. It was interesting for me to think: the very first liquid ever poured on the moon, and the very first food eaten there, were the communion elements."

³"When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars, which thou hast ordained; ⁴What is man, that thou art mindful of him? And the son of man, that thou visiteth him?"Psalm 8

"Magnificent desolation" were the words Aldrin used to describe what he saw as he surveyed the lunar landscape. He knew then, as we know now, that wherever we are, no matter how magnificent or how desolate is the place, God is with us. Whether we are before the altar at Gethsemane, or on the moon, God is with us, just as He was with Jesus and the twelve in the upper room on that Passover night in Jerusalem.

COOKIES FOR SUNDAY MORNING


Every Sunday cookies and coffee are enjoyed by our members and visitors in the gathering area prior to Sunday School. Help provide these cookies!

Our Savior Jesus Christ has destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel. Let us remember with thanksgiving what God has done through His beloved child Gladys.

Gladys D. Meyer Ward, age 88, went to be with her Heavenly Savior on June 29th, 2019. She grew up on a farm, working the cotton fields by the age of 8, her early education in a one-room schoolhouse. Her family moved to Houston when she was 12 and she went to school in the Houston Independent School District, attending Reagan High School, where she met the love of her life, Kenneth Ward. They married in 1949 and were married for 70 years.

Gladys worked outside the home, finally retiring after working 20 years as a Dental Assistant. A funloving woman with a quick smile, hearty laugh, and clever wit, she loved her family above all else. Special pre-service music by the Summer Counselors will begin at 10:30 a.m.


