Worthy SK's,



Brother Knights,

As a 3rd degree member of the Knights of Columbus, you are part of the largest Catholic fraternal organization in the world with nearly 2 million members. But have you achieved the highest degree of our Order? We only have 4 degrees. Charity, Unity, Fraternity Patriotism. ALL Knights should be 4th Degree members. When Blessed Michael J McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882, there were only 3 degrees in our order. In the late 19th century, there was some discrimination against Catholics. One reason for this discrimination against Catholics was that people thought that Catholics were more loyal to the Pope than they were to the United States of America. The Knights wanted to show that Catholics could be loyal to, and love both our faith and our country, so they created the Patriotic Degree, the 4th Degree of our Order. The first exemplification of this degree occurred on February 22nd. 1900, in New York City. This coming February, we will be celebrat-

The Mission of the 4th Degree is to honor our veterans, honoring Sir Knights, and their families at times of loss, and conducting patriotic educational programs. Why should you become a 4th Degree member of the Knights of Columbus?

- 4th Degree members earn the title of SIR KNIGHT (SK).
- There are only four degrees in the Knights of Columbus.
- Because you love our country, and you love our faith.
- When the time comes that God calls you home, you are eligible for the 4th Degree Honor Guard to be present at your Memorial Service. This benefit is also extended to your spouse, your parents, and your children.

- Chalice Program In your memory upon your passing, your name is engraved on a Chalice with the names of 3 other Sir Knights and you are remembered every time the Chalice is used in Mass.
- You are eligible to participate as a member of the Knights of Columbus Honor Guard

My Journey with God

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." - St. Paul. When you think of catholic education, you probably imagine a kid who lived their whole life surrounded by God, but that's not the case for me. My catholic faith has not always been a big part of my life. Back in Fresno, where I grew up, my life was not centered around religion. Besides from my mother teaching my brother and I the most fundamental prayer, the Our Father, no one was introducing me into the faith. It wasn't until I moved to Elk Grove and started attending St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, that my whole life changed. My catholic education has greatly increased my faith by teaching me all I know about God - laying a strong foundation for me, and now as I am preparing to head into high school, I want to continue my religious learning which is now such a vast aspect of my life.
