#### A Message from Our President

Aloha Kunia Orchid Society Members and Friends,

We had another eventful October month of learning and activities that we hoped you chose to participate in. Our Officers and Board of Directors plan for quality monthly general meetings with speakers aimed at sharing important orchid growing techniques and selected activities that can add to your over-all orchid experience.

For our October 1, meeting we had as our speakers, our own Linda Kurihara and Paulette Morimoto. Linda shared her own personal fertilizer recipe that she makes from eggshells, and the peels and core of an apple. After spraying her own simple but effective fertilizer on her orchid plants, she had seen an abundance of additional flower spikes that she attributes to her homemade fertilizer. Paulette shared with us her successful experience of using orchid husks in planting her orchids. She finds that using coconut husks is economical and easy to raise her orchids. Since many of us have had no experience planting with coconut husks, we all had a chance to pot an orchid using coconut husks. When that hands-on activity was done, we all had another orchid to take home and raise.

Another important activity for us during the month of October was the Honolulu Orchid Society's orchid show that was held on October 11, & 12. We were invited to create a display at their show, and we were glad to lend our support. As long as I have been a member, I always remember setting up a display at this annual show. We appreciate Suzanne Yamada who took the lead in getting ideas for our display and encouraging everyone to be a part of this annual show. She encouraged all of our members to share their blooming orchids, supporting non-orchid plants for the display and helping and learning from this experience. Suzanne's efforts resulting in over 20 members, including some non-member spouses helping with our display setup and take-down at the end of the show. We were fortunate to garner 5 trophy awards for KOS: Best White Vanda, Best Lavender Vanda, Best of Other Color Vanda, Best Species and Best Oncidiinae. We encourage all of our members to prepare now to display their show quality blooming orchids at our own KOS Orchid Show in March. Let's start grooming our orchid collections a little better, starting from today.

Our next major event is on November 16, the Mililani Orchid Club's Craft and Plant Sale. We need your help so we can have items to sell at our KOS booth that day. We would like to focus our efforts in obtaining donations of orchids, plants, and baked goods so we can raise funds to successfully run our education program for the upcoming years. Another important reason for us participating in this type of activity is providing exposure for our society in our own backyard.
