#### **DENDROBIUM CULTURE MADE EASY**

We were fortunate to have Roy Andrade speak to us at our November general meeting. Roy is an accredited American Orchid Society and Honolulu Orchid Society judge and has travelled to the mainland and Japan for judging. He started growing orchids in 1991, starting with about 20 dendrobium plants and now has over 1,000 orchids of various kinds. His huge dendrobium orchids can often be seen at the various local orchid shows.

The Dendrobium genus is one of the largest of all orchid groups with nearly 2,000 species. They are native to southeast Asia where they grow in different types of climates. As our guest speaker for the month, Roy introduced the members to the different types of dendrobiums that he has cultivated, covering the importance of light, air circulation, watering, fertilizing and re-potting. Our Plant Commentary winners for the evening were lucky to take home an orchid plant that was brought by Roy.



As a current resident of Oahu, this may have been one of the last

times to receive a presentation from Roy. He and his wife Sheila plan to re-locate to Las Vegas next year. As the long time President of the Ewa Orchid Society, we will certainly miss seeing Roy and Sheila at many of our local orchid meetings and events.
